



A Guide to Union College Computing Services

The Office of Information Technology Services (ITS) welcomes you to Union College. Academic computing services are provided by ITS to assist Union College faculty, students, and academic support staff in using computers to do their instructional or research tasks. Here is the information you will need to get started.

ITS provides a variety of academic computing services to the Union College community. These services include:

- ResNet network connections and software support for the Residence Halls
- Computer training seminars
- Student Consultants to provide basic software help with the Windows, Macintosh, and multi-user systems
- Documentation for computer resources, including on-line help facilities and “How to” sheets
- Virus protection for Windows and Macintosh platforms
- Public computing facilities available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week

These services are offered at no cost to students of the Union College community. The office of Information Technology Services maintains regular College office hours, 8:30AM – 4:54PM, Monday through Friday. Appointments are appreciated.

E-MAIL

E-mail accounts are available to all students of Union College at no charge. All students may obtain an account at the ITS offices located in Steinmetz Hall, Room 109. Accounts will be made available within 24 hours after submission of an AFCA (Application for Computer Account) Monday through Thursday. All AFCAs submitted on Friday will be activated the following Monday. AFCAs may also be downloaded from the ITS web site (look under Student Services). This account is effective until graduation for full-time undergraduate students. *Part-time* student accounts are active while students are enrolled in courses.

NETWORK STORAGE

All students with an email account also have network storage space available to them at no charge. Students are provided with network storage space that is accessible throughout the campus. RESIDENCE HALL COMPUTER NETWORK (ResNet)

ResNet is an Ethernet network service. Students who own computers and live in the Residence Halls can access campus and world-wide electronic resources from their rooms on a 24-hour-per-day basis. To connect to ResNet, your computer must have an Ethernet connection. Network cables may be purchased at the Bookstore. More information about ResNet is at <http://resnet.union.edu>.

SERVICES

Virus Protection

The College provides free virus scanning software for all students. McAfee's VirusScan (Windows) and Virex (Macintosh) can be downloaded from the Web. The URL is <http://its.union.edu/jservices/software.htm>. Please note that this site is ONLY accessible from on-campus or through VPN.

VPN

VPN (**V**irtual **P**rivate **N**etwork) is used to create a secure means of access for off-campus users (e.g. from your home computer). With the VPN you can access network resources such as Schaffer Library's Databases & Indexes page, the Union FTP server, and other campus servers. To get a VPN account, stop by ITS and fill out an application for an off-campus account.

USTAR

USTAR (**U**nion **S**tudent **T**echnical **A**ssistance **R**esources) students provide a viable, trained and coordinated user support program to the students and faculty. At the same time, USTAR allows the students involved to accumulate on the job technical and professional experience and mentoring skills. They can provide hardware, software and networking support to students. Assistance can requested through the web at <http://ustar.union.edu>.

PUBLIC COMPUTING FACILITIES

Computer labs are available for instructional work. The Windows Lab, the Macintosh Lab, and the Steenstrup Multimedia Lab, all located in Steinmetz Hall, are open 24 hours a day. Access is gained by using your Union College ID Card with the Card Access System located on or near the door to the lab.

Steenstrup Multimedia Lab

The Multimedia Lab is located in Steinmetz 100. It has three Windows and three Macintosh workstations with software for multimedia, image, video and audio editing. Video capture, image and text scanning is available on all computers.

Windows Lab

The Windows Lab contains 15 Windows computers and is located in Steinmetz 110. This lab provides access for students to word processing, spreadsheet, database, programming languages, graphics, utilities, and web browsing software. An handicap-accessible workstation is also available.

Macintosh Lab

The Macintosh Lab is located in Steinmetz 101. Six Macintosh computers installed with word processing, spreadsheet, graphics, utilities, and web browsing software packages are available for all students.

Learning Center – F.W. Olin Center

The Learning Center (Olin 210) contains both Windows and Macintosh computers. This facility provides students with access to all of the general use applications used on campus (word processing, spreadsheet, database, and Internet) as well as some applications used by specific departments/courses. The Learning Center is open the same hours as the building. Access is gained by using your Union College ID Card with the Card Access System located on or near the door to the Center.

Student Support

Information Technology Services employs part-time student consultants to assist users with general questions and software packages. The student consultants are available for extended weekday hours and on weekends. Check the schedule posted outside the Consultants' Office (Steinmetz Hall, Room 108A) or the Learning Center (Olin 210) for their hours.

Departmental Computing Facilities

A number of departments have their own labs on campus that give students access to computers. Each department sets its own policies and procedures. You can check with the department secretary to see if your department has a departmental lab.
