Biographic Note:

George Bain was a member of the class of 1973. Since graduating from Union, Bain has been an active member in the Union Alumni community. In the late 1990s, he served as the chairman of the Friends of the Library. He also has been involved in several fundraising campaigns including the Campaign for Schaffer Library, which raised money for the library's 1998 renovation.

Scope and Content Note:

The George Bain papers contains research papers written by Bain while attending Union College and materials related to his work as chairman of the Friends of Union College Library. The majority of the collection is research papers. They were written between 1969 and 1972 for various history courses. All of the papers relate to American History, particularly the Revolutionary War era. There are two folders of material related to the Friends of the Library. This includes the organization's newsletters from 1994 and 1996 as well as materials from the Campaign for Schaffer Library.
