

## **\*\*SPRING TERM 2006 REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS\*\***

Course selections must be made in consultation with faculty advisors. The 2005-06 Academic Register gives full descriptions of courses as well as information on prerequisites. Additional course descriptions may be found within this document.

**Effective Fall Term 2005**, a new four level course numbering scheme was put in to place. Courses numbered 0-49 will be those that carry no credit. Courses numbered 50-99 are designated for General Education or other courses that do not count for the major. Courses numbered 100-199 are all introductory level offerings. Courses numbered 200-299 are those at the sophomore/junior level that may also be taken by non-majors. Courses numbered 300-399 are upper-level which are primarily intended for majors, i.e. which represent the depth component of the major. Courses numbered 400-499 are all advanced level courses for seniors, including those used to fulfill the Senior Writing Experience (WS), seminars, research, thesis and independent studies.

**WRITTEN PERMISSION** from your advisor is required and must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar when taking less than the normal course load (three (3) courses) per term. Please see Page 2 for information regarding fourth courses.

**To all students planning to enroll in their first foreign language course at Union:** Before you sign up you must meet with the Modern Languages department to determine the level at which you should be placed, even if you have studied the same language in high school. You will be given a placement recommendation form that must be brought to the Registrar either during prescheduling or add/drop. No student will be allowed to register for a language course unless they 1) have taken the prerequisite course **here at Union** or 2) have a signed placement recommendation form. For information on prerequisites, please refer to the catalog.

**Please Note:** Union College and The Graduate College of Union University are two separate Colleges. All graduate level courses taken by Union undergraduates, including Leadership in Medicine and Combined Degree students will be taken through the Graduate College of Union University and will require completion of a special "Graduate College of Union University" Cross Registration Form. These forms are available in the Registrar's Office in Silliman Hall.

## **Fourth Course Policy**

The annual tuition at Union allows a student to register for three terms taking three courses per term. This allows students to complete the required 36 courses for graduation. In some Engineering programs as many as 40 courses may be required and those students are permitted to enroll in 10 courses per year. Under certain circumstances students may be allowed to take a fourth course in a term.

Students who are making satisfactory progress in their program of study are allowed to enroll in one fourth course during an academic year at no extra charge, provided they have a GPA of at least 3.3. These courses can be used to enhance the student's academic experience at Union, as can any additional fourth courses, for which there will be a fee. All such courses will appear on the transcript and can be used to fulfill program requirements; however, they can not be used for the purpose of accelerated graduation. (This includes fourth courses taken on a Term Abroad.)

Fourth courses can also be used to make up a deficiency in credits due to withdrawals or failure or if a student does not have the requisite GPA. A 4<sup>th</sup> course fee will be charged under these circumstances (for 2005-2006 the fee will be approximately \$2,445). Students whose GPA is below 2.5 will need the written permission of Dean Rosenthal before signing up for a fourth course.

All students, including engineering students, will be required to fill out the "Petition to Enroll in a Fourth Course" form. Forms are available at the Registrar's Office in Silliman Hall or on the web.

**\*\*\* DESCRIPTIONS OF COURSES NOT IN THE  
2005-2006 ACADEMIC REGISTER \*\*\***

**ACC 100: Survey of Accounting** - A survey of selected topics within various areas of accounting such as managerial accounting, financial accounting and tax accounting. Emphasis will be on concepts and not on record keeping.

**ADA 045: Tap Dance Practicum** - Tap dance provides students with the study of steps found in the tap dancing art form. Students will be introduced to proper warm up, tap steps, specific exercises in rhythms, routines, and use of music. For dancers, adding a tap class will give them the opportunity to learn about a new dance form. Students that have previous experience in tap will be able to expand their expertise. For the theater students the learning of tap can eventually be useful for musicals. \$100 Fee. Please refer to the Misc. Notes on Page six (6) regarding possible credit.

**ANT 135: Fundamentalism Around the Globe** - This course examines the spread of fundamentalist and evangelical religions around the world, and at theories about the appeal and impact of fundamentalism. We will start with a series of general, comparative works analyzing the rise of fundamentalist strains of Christianity, Islam, and other religions around the world. We will then move to specific case studies analyzing the impact and appeal of various fundamentalist religions in the Pacific, in the Caribbean, in South Africa, in the US, in the Middle East and in Indonesia. Issues covered will include: the relationship between fundamentalism and modernity; the place of women in fundamentalist religious movements and so on.

**ANT 186: The Political Economy of Southern Africa** - This course looks at the role of commodities, colonialism and culture in the development of colonial and post-colonial Africa. This course looks explicitly at the role of diamonds and gold in the construction of race, identity, the environment, and culture. While the course will focus on Southern Africa, case studies from other areas (Nigeria and oil, Sudan and oil) will be examined as points of comparison. GenEd: CDAA

**ANT 190: Embodying East Asia: Anthropological Understandings of the Body in Japan, China, and Korea** - This course deals with different approaches to understanding the socio-cultural role of the body in East Asia. Does the Western idea of Cartesian duality apply? How are expressions of the political class, ethnicity, race, and gender somatized? How are bodies read and made legible? Many in the social sciences have proposed that persons are composed of more than the singular body (individual body, social body, etc.). Using this as a guide, this course examines a variety of bodies and the spaces of their production – including sports, race, discipline, medicine and disease, beauty, and nationalized bodies. GenEd: CDEA

**AVA 101:** See description in Academic Register for MER 101.

**AVA 262: Real and Recorded Time** - An introduction to the basic concepts of time-based artwork, using a variety of processes and media. Students explore concepts of sequence, performance, interactivity, motion, process and documentation through video, audio and installation-oriented projects. Prerequisites: AVA 160 or CSC 060.

**BCH 335: Survey of Biochemistry (cross listed w/Bio 335 & Chem 335)** - A survey of topics in biochemistry including buffers, protein structure, lipid structure, carbohydrate structure, enzyme mechanism, and enzyme kinetics. The pathways by which biomolecules are synthesized and degraded will be investigated. Specifically we will look at carbohydrate, lipid and nitrogen metabolism. Medical applications will be emphasized throughout the course. Prerequisites: CHM 231 and BIO 125 (CHM 232 recommended). Not open to students who have taken BIO 380 or CHM 382.

**BIO 059: The Biology of Aging w/Lab** - The study of aging is a tremendous challenge to the human intellect because we are faced with some of the most ancient and profound questions. Why do we grow old? Is death inevitable? Can aging be slowed down? Is rejuvenation possible? Why do some living things live for thousands of years and some for a few hours? The scientist's task is to ask questions that can be approached experimentally leading to many of the "why" questions remaining unanswered and many "what" and "how" questions becoming more clear. This course explores the biological aspects of aging. We define and characterize aging in human populations, individuals, and in many of our component organs, tissues, cells, organelles, and molecules. Theories of why we age, mechanisms of how we age, and many of the common conditions associated with aging are described. Disease and aging are distinguished and strategies for possible extension of the prime of life are considered. The lab component will include topics in exercise physiology, a self-analysis of some of the biomarkers of aging, and the dissection of a fetal pig. This course does not have prior biology or chemistry as prerequisites; aspects of these subject areas are clearly presented as required. GenEd: SCLB

**CLS 227: Entrepreneurship in the Ancient World** - "Entrepreneurship" (or seizing upon and exploiting opportunity) is a mindset that has existed at various times and places. Through a variety of ancient sources, including legal, historical, and literary works, students will use the ancient world as a laboratory in which to observe and to assess what may or may not have constituted opportunity in the past and to examine strategies employed (as well as opportunities missed) for taking advantage of available resources in a variety of situations: economic, political, and religious. GenEd: ANCS

**ECE 222: Introduction to Circuits and Electronics** - Electrical quantities, circuit principles, analysis and response of basic circuits, semiconductor physics, diodes, transistors, and operational amplifiers. Includes a weekly lab. Not open to Electrical or Computer Engineering majors, or to students who have taken ECE 225. Prerequisites: MTH 130, PHY 121

**EGL 239E: Modern African Fiction** - This course examines selected major African novels and short stories. We will analyze Africa's literary responses to the various ironical positions they find themselves after independence. We will contrast the lives of ordinary African's as brought to life in African fiction, with Western media narratives of 'misery' in Africa. Finally, we will ask, is there such a thing as African Fiction? What does it mean?

**HST 333: The Hollywood Film: An American History** - The history of one of the most important aspects of American culture as seen at home and from abroad from the silent era to the present. We will learn the basic chronology of American dramatic film history, the cultural and political history of the industry, the tools of historical film research and some of the methods of technical film analysis.

**HST 340A: Topics in the History of Modern Italy** - This course covers the period in Italian history from the French Revolution to present, focusing on the political and cultural issues surrounding national unification, the development of fascism, the era of leftist violence, and the rise of Berlusconi.

**IDM 100: Globalization** - Thomas Friedman has referred to globalization as "the next big thing" in the post Cold-War world, with political, economic, cultural and security implications. Whether "the next big thing" or not, globalization is clearly a force to be reckoned with and making its fundamental premises important to understand. Yet never has a term gone so quickly from obscurity to meaninglessness – its use and definitions fungible and often inappropriately used to cavalierly explain any issue. This course

offers interdisciplinary examination and overview of globalization. Nine Union professors and one outside speaker, representing five disciplines, will lecture on aspects of globalization relating to their disciplines (earth sciences, economics, political science, computer science, engineering, and anthropology). Most speakers will examine the major concepts of, and rival theoretical frameworks, for thinking about globalization in his/her discipline.

**IDM 299: Developing a Vision** - Throughout history, leaders in many contexts have used “vision” as a means to not only communicate their desires for the future but also to motivate their followers and supporters to great achievements. This course focuses on developing skills in creating, articulating and planning a vision that will inspire the students (and their supporters) to achieve their goals. This class is intended for mature students who want to learn skills that will help them understand and shape the world around them.

**MTH 055: Ancient Greek Mathematics** - Ancient Greek mathematicians invented the notion of abstraction (in mathematics and in other fields), absolute precision, and proof. The approach to mathematics that we take today can be traced back to these Greek mathematicians. After examining some pre-Greek mathematical traditions, we study Greek mathematics, beginning with Thales and Pythagoras. Topics include: intellectual crisis caused by the discovery that not all magnitudes are commensurable; Plato and his academy; Euclid and his *Elements*; the three special construction problems (trisecting an angle, squaring a circle, doubling a cube); and the greatest of the Greek mathematicians, Archimedes. GenEd: MATH

**MTH 138: Methods of Applied Mathematics I** - An introduction to the mathematical techniques and analysis of ordinary differential equations, partial differential equations, and complex variables. The emphasis is on the equations arising from physical, biological and economic phenomena. Prerequisite: Math 130 or Math 234.

**PHL 236: Philosophy of Psychology** - This course is a survey of the major contemporary views about the philosophical foundations of psychology. We will consider such questions as: What are the commitments of common-sense (or ‘folk’) psychology, and how are they related to those of contemporary scientific psychology? To what extent is human cognition modular? How much of the structure and content of the adult mind is innate? What underlies our capacity to make inferences about the mental states of others? How should we understand the psychological evidence for widespread human irrationality, especially in light of some philosophical arguments that such irrationality is impossible? Are mental states individuated solely in terms of properties that are internal to an organism, or are mental states individuated in part by an organism’s relation to its environment? What is the best way to model human cognition generally? Do humans think in a mental language (a ‘language of thought’), or do so-called ‘connectionist networks’ offer a better model of our minds? This course presupposes no prior knowledge of philosophy or psychology.

**PHL 305: Moral Relativism & Realism** - It is fashionable to claim all moral judgments are 'relative' and that a judgment that is 'true for' another person may not be 'true for' you, plus, 'who is to decide' whether some act is right or wrong? To be sure, some claimed we can no longer 'afford' relativism (and worse, skepticism) in the light of '9/11' which, they say, calls for 'moral clarity', but saying doesn't make it so. we are gored on the dilemma: affirm moral knowledge but then deny diversity or affirm diversity but deny moral knowledge. In the course we will read some of the important literature on moral skepticism, realism and relativism. Students should have some philosophy coursework behind them in order to avoid the initial shock of difficult philosophical writing. GenEd: WAC

All graduate level courses taken by Union undergraduates, including Leadership in Medicine and Combined Degree students will be taken through the Graduate College of Union University and will require completion of a special “Graduate College of Union University” Cross Registration Form. These forms are available in the Registrar’s Office in Silliman Hall.

Cross Registration has been a service of the Member Institutions of the Hudson Mohawk Association since 1970, when the Association was chartered by the New York State Board of Regents.
