Course selections must be made in consultation with faculty advisors. The 2007-08 Academic Register gives full descriptions of courses as well as information on prerequisites. Additional course descriptions may be found within this document.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM: Courses numbered 0-49 will be those that carry no credit. Courses numbered 50-99 are designated for General Education or other courses that do not count for the major. Courses numbered 100-199 are all introductory level offerings. Courses numbered 200-299 are those at the sophomore/junior level that may also be taken by non-majors. Courses numbered 300-399 are upper-level which are primarily intended for majors, i.e. which represent the depth component of the major. Courses numbered 400-499 are all advanced level courses for seniors, including those used to fulfill the Senior Writing Experience (WS), seminars, research, thesis and independent studies.

COURSE LOAD: Written Permission from your advisor is required and must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar when taking less than the normal course load (three (3) courses) per term. Please see Page 2 for information regarding fourth courses.

To all students interested in continuing or starting a new foreign language at Union. Before you sign up for your first language course at Union, you must check with the Modern Languages department so that the level at which you should be placed can be determined, even if you have studied the same language in high school. You will be given a placement recommendation form that must be brought to the Registrar either during prescheduling or add/drop. For information on prerequisites, please refer to the catalog. No student will be allowed to register for a language course unless they:

- 1) have taken the prerequisite course **here at Union** or
- 2) have a signed placement recommendation form.

DISCLOSURE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION: Union College hereby designates the following student information as public or "Directory Information." Such information may be disclosed by the institution for any purpose, at its discretion:

Name, address (campus, home, e-mail), telephone numbers, date and place of birth, academic fields of study, dates of attendance, ID photographs, participation in recognized activities and sports, degrees and awards, weight and height of athletic team members, most previous educational agency or institution attended, or other similar information. The College may publicize or respond to requests for such information at its discretion. However the use of these records for commercial or political purposes is prohibited unless approved by the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Union College assumes that failure on the part of any student to specifically request the withholding of "Directory Information" indicates individual approval for disclosure. Furthermore, pursuant to the terms of the Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, Union College reserves the right to publish or release any or all of the above "Directory Information" for internal institutional use only, whether or not a student requests the withholding of such information by the means indicated above.

Fourth Course Policy

The annual tuition at Union allows a student to register for three terms taking three courses per term. This allows students to complete the required 36 courses for graduation. In some Engineering programs as many as 40 courses may be required and those students are permitted to enroll in 10 courses per year. Under certain circumstances students may be allowed to take a fourth course in a term.

Students who are making satisfactory progress in their program of study are allowed to enroll in one fourth course during an academic year at no extra charge, provided they have a GPA of at least 3.3. These courses can be used to enhance the student's academic experience at Union. All such courses will appear on the transcript and can be used to fulfill program requirements; however, they can not be used for the purpose of accelerated graduation. (This includes fourth courses taken on a Term Abroad.)

Fourth courses can also be used to make up a deficiency in credits due to withdrawals or failure or if a student does not have the requisite GPA. A 4th course fee will be charged under these circumstances (for 2007-2008 the fee will be approximately \$2,720). Students whose GPA is below 2.5 will need the written permission of Dean Rosenthal before signing up for a fourth course.

All students, including engineering students, will be required to fill out the "Petition to Enroll in a Fourth Course" form. Forms are available at the Registrar's Office in Silliman Hall or on the web.

***** DESCRIPTIONS OF COURSES NOT IN THE
2007-2008 ACADEMIC REGISTER *****

AOP 300 Professional Development. Prof. Keraga. The purpose of this course is to assist Junior AOP students in developing their personal effectiveness in the professional world. This course will focus on personal and career development to assist an effective transition from college to the working world or graduate school. Through interactive learning students will have the opportunity to practice and enhance skills. Prerequisite: Jr. Standing.

ARB 100 Basic Arabic I. Prof. Saffar. A basic course for students who begin with no knowledge of Arabic. Structure, reading, and audiolingual training.

AVA-363 3D Computer Modeling. Prof. Orellana. This course will introduce students into the world of three-dimensional computer graphics. Through this hands-on-course, students will learn how to use 3D software to realize ideas in sculpture, virtual environments, 3D modeling, installation, rapid prototyping, and animation.

HST 160 Early British History from the Renaissance to the Glorious Revolution, 1400 to 1714. Prof. Tadros. This is a survey course explains the various religious, political, and economic events that uniquely defined England during this period. From Catholicism to Protestantism (in its various forms); from a minor political player to a legitimate force on the international scene; and from the manor to a market economy, the course pieces together the forces that helped shape England as a global power on the eve of “modernity.”

HST 200 One Hundred Years of American Business History, 1880-1980. Prof. Delton. This course examines the internal development of American business and industry, as well as its changing relations to the state, unions, and society from the Gilded Age of the 1880s to the Reagan era. Topics include magnates and entrepreneurs, technological innovation, the managerial revolution, the rise of corporate liberalism, and the post-industrial economy. The course will be available to sophomores and juniors. GenEd: AMCS

HST 203 Judaism/Christianity/Islam: Comparative Perspectives. Prof. Bedford. See REL 203

MLT 289 Literature of the Mexican- American Border. Prof. Martinez. This course is designed to teach the students through literary and social science readings and film about the complexities of the Mexican-American border. Readings will focus on issues of racial identity, language, socio-economic status and cultural practices. The historical focus will range from the turn of the 20th century to contemporary. GenEd: CDLA/AML/LCC

PHL 255 On War & Killing. Prof. Walker. The central goal of this course is to develop and apply some useful tools for critical reflection upon the morality of war. In considering this issue we will focus on two main questions: (i) that of *jus ad bellum* -- what, if anything, makes it right to go to war?, and (ii) that of *jus in bello* - what kinds of actions are, and are not, justified in carrying out a war? Attempting to answer these questions will involve a theoretical component, in which we critically reflect upon attempts by both historical and contemporary philosophers to answer these questions in the abstract, as well as an applied component in which we apply these theoretical considerations in the evaluation of actual historical and contemporary situations. We will consider a wide array of violent conflicts, including World War II, the Vietnam War, the current war and occupation of Iraq, and the violence in Darfur. GenEd: EUC

PSC 050 Pi Sigma Alpha Journal Practicum. Prof. Oxley. This course will be designed to provide guidance and hands-on experience for editing a research journal. Students enrolled in the course will be serving on the editorial board of the *Pi Sigma Alpha Undergraduate Journal of Politics*. This journal, sponsored by Pi Sigma Alpha, the national political science honor society, will be hosted by Union College for three years beginning in

the Fall of 2007. The journal publishes manuscripts from undergraduate political science students from across the nation. Editorial board membership will be open to all Union members of Pi Sigma Alpha.

Student objectives include learning about the peer review process, creating processes for reviewing submitted manuscripts, reviewing the submitted manuscripts, and making decisions about which manuscripts to publish in each issue (two issues will be published each year). Reviewing the submitted manuscripts will require the students serving on the editorial board to evaluate, among other things, writing quality, significance of research findings, and the appropriateness and rigor of research methodology. Doing so will reinforce the knowledge they have gained from their political science courses and will help to develop the students' critical thinking skills. When the board meets to decide which manuscripts to reject and which to send on for further consideration, students will need to make the case for their preferred manuscripts, therefore polishing the students' verbal communication skills. Prerequisite: Pi Sigma Alpha membership.

PSC 255 Politics of International Security. Prof. Watson. It is widely understood that the terrorist attacks in the US on September 11, 2001 represent a watershed event in the study of international security. What is less understood is that it was only one event in a series that stretches in time both before and after 9/11 itself. Further, international terrorism as the latest threat to international security is only one facet of the greater puzzle. Nuclear, chemical, and biological weapons continue to represent distinct dangers to international system. But they also must be examined through the broader context of rogue states and clandestine groups bent on using these weapons against the world. Lastly, these variables all come together within historical regional, ethnic, and religious conflicts to create a mosaic of security problems for the 21st century.

This course is intended to take a broad survey of international security studies based upon mainstream theoretical approaches to the field. After a preliminary discussion of basic security theories ranging from Just War tradition and deterrence, to nonproliferation and preemption, specific issues and cases will be examined. The main foci will be WMD proliferation, international terrorism, rogue states, and arms control. The goal will be to present them as a set of interconnected issues requiring a broader understanding of international conflict and its components. Lastly, the issues will be examined relative to international and US policies in order to develop an understanding of the current study of the politics of international security. GenEd: AMCS

PSC 343R Women and Politics in the Muslim World. Prof. Angrist. In this reading-, writing-, and discussion-intensive course, we will study how politics and women intersect across the Muslim world (i.e. the Middle East, but also parts of Sub-Saharan Africa and Central/South/Southeast Asia). Empirically, we will examine similarities and differences in the degree to which women wield social, economic, and political power in their home countries. Theoretically, we will explore competing explanations for women's varying status in the region. Sample topics for discussion include Islam and women, the veil, honor killings, and the six female prime ministers/presidents that the Muslim world has produced to date. Prerequisites: Sophomore Standing.

REL 203 Judaism/Christianity/Islam: Comparative Perspectives. Prof. Bedford. A comparative study of three great monotheistic traditions. Outlines how each understands its origin and historical development, and also examines the similarities and differences between the three traditions in respect to ideas of God; revelation, scripture and tradition; mysticism; and community and politics.

ADA-010 and ADA-020 are for beginners and ADA-035 and ADA-040 are for students of all levels.

ENGLISH DEPARTMENT COURSE CURRICULUM REVISION:

The English department has made substantial changes to their curriculum effective with the Fall 2006 course offerings. English majors should meet with their advisers to discuss the impact of these changes on their program of study if they have not already done so.

Students wishing to take English courses to satisfy GenEd requirements may take Intermediate Courses after taking one Introductory Course. For most Intermediate Courses, either of the Introductory Courses (EGL 100 or 101) will suffice. **However, during the transition from the old GenEd program to the new core components curriculum, students who have taken *any* English department course will be considered to have met the requirement for an Introductory Course.**

In Addition for the class of 2008; any literature course will satisfy the Section I GenEd requirement regardless of the student's history/survey or European/American track.

Any Gen Ed student who has not yet taken an English course will need to enroll in Introduction to Literary Studies. Any Gen Ed student who has already taken one English course may enroll in an intermediate (200-level) course. Any Gen Ed student who has already taken two English courses may enroll in an intermediate (200-level) course or a junior seminar (300-level). Senior seminars (400-level) are reserved exclusively for majors.

MULTIPLE SECTION COURSES: SPECIAL NOTE TO ALL STUDENTS SIGNING UP FOR COURSES WHICH HAVE MULTIPLE SECTIONS, ESPECIALLY IN THE SCIENCES: Due to the possibility of over and under enrollments in certain sections of multiple section courses, the Registrar's Office, at the request of department chairs, may switch students out of their originally scheduled courses in order to balance the sections.

CROSS-REFERENCED COURSES: The first course is the cross-referenced course and the **second** course is the "**Main**" course. Students have the option of signing up for the course under one of the two department headings. If you have a question about the course, or if it is designated as a "petition" course, please see the department that is listed **second (the main course)**.
