Course selections must be made in consultation with faculty advisors. The 2007-08 Academic Register gives full descriptions of courses as well as information on prerequisites. Additional course descriptions may be found within this document.

**COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM:** Courses numbered 0-49 carry no credit. Courses numbered 50-99 are designated for General Education or other courses that do not count for the major. Courses numbered 100-199 are all introductory level offerings. Courses numbered 200-299 are those at the sophomore/junior level that may also be taken by non-majors. Courses numbered 300-399 are upper-level which are primarily intended for majors, i.e. courses which represent the depth component of the major. Courses numbered 400-499 are all advanced level courses for seniors, including those used to fulfill the Senior Writing Experience (WS), seminars, research, thesis and independent studies.

**COURSE LOAD: Written Permission** from your advisor is required and must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar when taking less than the normal course load (three (3) courses) per term. See below for information regarding fourth courses.

**FOREIGN LANGUAGES:** Before you sign up for your first language course at Union, you must check with the Modern Languages department so that the level at which you should be placed can be determined, even if you have studied the same language in high school. You will be given a placement recommendation form that must be brought to the Registrar either during prescheduling or add/drop. For information on prerequisites, please refer to the catalog. No student will be allowed to register for a language course unless they: 1) have taken the prerequisite course **here at Union** or 2) have a signed placement recommendation form.

## **Fourth Course Policy**

The annual tuition at Union allows a student to register for three terms taking three courses per term. This allows students to complete the required 36 courses for graduation. In some Engineering programs as many as 40 courses may be required and those students are permitted to enroll in 10 courses per year. Under certain circumstances students may be allowed to take a fourth course in a term.

Students who are making satisfactory progress in their program of study are allowed to enroll in one fourth course during an academic year at no extra charge, provided they have a GPA of at least 3.3. These courses can be used to enhance the student's academic experience at Union. All such courses will appear on the transcript and can be used to fulfill program requirements; however, they can not be used for the purpose of accelerated graduation. (This includes fourth courses taken on a Term Abroad.)

Fourth courses can also be used to make up a deficiency in credits due to withdrawals or failure or if a student does not have the requisite GPA. A 4<sup>th</sup> course fee will be charged under these circumstances (for 2007-2008 the fee will be approximately \$2,720). Students whose GPA is below 2.5 will need the written permission of Dean Rosenthal before signing up for a fourth course.

All students, including engineering students, with the exception of Leadership in Medicine (LIM) and Scholar Students will be required to fill out the "Petition to Enroll in a Fourth Course" form. **\*\*\* DESCRIPTIONS OF COURSES NOT IN THE  
2007-2008 ACADEMIC REGISTER \*\*\***

**AAH 306 Color Pigments and Paintings in the Middle Ages and Renaissance.** Prof. Matthew. This course examines the material and techniques used by Western European painters during the period ca. 1200 to ca. 1600. We will also be examining theories concerning color and light as articulated by intellectuals and practitioners of the period. Because many artisans other than painters used color (and the colorants and other materials needed to obtain color), we will occasionally be widening our scope to examine, for example, various forms of glass, ceramics and dyed textiles. Our main focus will be on Italy, but we will take excursions north across the Alps at certain moments in the course. This course is also intended to introduce you to the role of scientific examination, analysis and treatment of paintings, and what they do (or do not) tell us about materials, techniques, and the tastes for colors and coloristic effects in the periods we are covering. Prerequisites: Any AAH Course.

**AAH 320 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> Century European Art.** Prof. Ogawa. This course will introduce students to the major European art movements of the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries. It will be structured chronologically and cover the art of the Catholic Counter-reformation, the “Golden Age” in the Netherlands, the art under the absolute monarchy in France, the Rococo period, and the rise of Neo-classicism during the enlightenment. We will examine the stylistic characteristics of these major movements, and explore the relationships between art and religious, political, and cultural history. GENED: EUC Prerequisites: AAH 101, 102, 103, or instructor’s permission.

**ADA 060 Hip Hop Dance 1 Practicum.** Prof. Domenico. This class gives students the opportunity to learn the basic of this popular and important dance form. A style based on routines from street jazz, breaking, popping, and locking. This dance style welcomes students with no previous dance experience and is a dazzling way for students to gain confidence in their body to today’s most celebrated pop music. No prerequisite.

**ADA 061 Hip Hop Dance II Practicum.** Prof. Domenico. This class provides trained dancers with a high energy class in an innovative dance style. Hip Hop is urban, it’s diverse, and it’s forever changing. The freestyle dance fusion gives students the opportunity to develop their own sense of style to the latest hit songs. Intermediate level.

**ADA 070 Choreography: Modern Dance Practicum.** Prof. Moutillet. This class will give students the opportunity to participate in the creation of a dance piece. We will focus on the post-modern era and its dance vocabulary by rehearsing cumulative movements, 1960s-80s music, and the integration of multi-media. Each week the class will build on created material which will ultimately lead to the completion of a dance work to be presented as part of the Winter Dance Concert 2008. Intermediate and advance level.

**ADA 071 Choreography: Jazz Practicum.** Prof. Rogers. This class offers students the chance to be a part of a dance creation. Each week the class will participate in the composition of an innovative dance utilizing the jazz form. This class will primarily focus upon the post-modern dance vocabulary of the 1960s-1980s. Through participation in this class, students will explore a wide range of intricate and innovative movements as a means of self-expression and individual study. The result will be presented as part of the Winter Dance Concert 2008. Intermediate and advance level.

**ANT 170 Myth, Ritual and Magic.** Prof. Bedford. This class explores myth, ritual and magic from historical and anthropological perspectives. It draws on examples of religious expression that highlight their interrelationships, and discusses their meaning and significance in ancient and modern religious communities. Examples will be drawn from areas including ancient Egypt, shamanism and western esoteric traditions.

**ATH 240 Theater Criticism.** Prof. Culbert. This is an intensive and practical course on reading and writing dramatic criticism. A look at the concepts and practices of theater criticism in American Theater begins with a discussion of major theories of Western drama, from Aristotle to Artaud. Through the reading and discussion of contemporary examples of dramatic criticism and directed studies in techniques of journalistic writing students will gain an understanding of the nature and function of a theater review and an ability to critically view theater productions. Writing will include research essays, response papers and critical reviews of play scripts as well as performances on campus and at professional theaters. Prerequisite: ATH 110 or instructor's permission.

**BIO 202 Cell Motility and the Cytoskeleton** Prof. Danowski. This course will investigate the mechanisms underlying the process of cell Motility, including swimming locomotion (powered by cilia and flagella), crawling cell locomotion, muscle contraction, and bacterial chemotaxis. We'll consider the mechanical and biochemical properties of the cytoskeleton and how they enable cell locomotion.

**CSC 106 Can Computers Think? An Introduction to Computer Science, Artificial Intelligence, and Programming.** Prof. Striegnitz. This course is an introduction to computer science and programming that uses artificial intelligence as an overarching theme. On the one hand, it will introduce students to algorithms, basic data structures, and programming techniques. On the other hand, it will discuss questions in the philosophy of artificial intelligence and introduce some basic methods from artificial intelligence (search, game playing, machine learning) Cluster: QMR. Petition Required.

**CSC 280 User Interfaces.** Prof. Fernandes. Introduction to the field of Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) through the study of user interfaces, theory and application of what makes an interface usable. Design principals, empirical studies, and statistical analysis will be employed in team based projects. Students will make extensive use of the LESS empirical laboratory for recording and analyzing subjects. Prerequisite: CSC 140.

**ENS 460 Senior Capstone in Environmental Studies.** Prof. Cockburn. This course brings together the expertise and experience of all environmental studies seniors to study contemporary environmental issues, usually related to a single topic or small number of topics. Issues may include legal cases, legislation and regulation, application of technology to social problems, and national and global environmental policy. Class time may include discussion, debate, field trips, class presentations, and outside speakers. Research and presentation of findings will be stressed. Prerequisite: Senior standing.

**FRN 432 Imagining Algeria: Representations of Algeria in French and Francophone Literature and Film.** Prof. Loth. This course focuses on artistic representations of Algeria in French and Franco-Algerian literature, film, and painting in order to gain perspective on the complex continuing relationship between these two nations. Topics to be explored include Orientalism and the legacies of colonial representation, national identity, the Algerian War, postcolonial identities, and *pied-noir* identity. The texts of this course introduce students to the importance of the Algerian territory in France's construction of its own national identity during the colonial period and to the narratives of resistance to French colonialism in Algerian literature and film. GenEd: CDAA. Prerequisite: FRN 201 or any FRN 300 level course.

**GEO 255 Volcanology w/ Lab.** Prof. Frey. This course teaches an overview of the geological, chemical, and physical processes that generate volcanoes and the implication of volcanic activity for humankind. Topics include tectonic environments associated with volcanism and what they tell us about Earth's internal processes; properties, generation, and evolution of magmas and magma chambers; eruptive mechanisms; classification of volcanic deposits; climatic effects; and volcanic hazards, including their prediction and mitigation. Labs will include case studies of classic volcanic eruptions. Prerequisite: Any introductory geology course; weekly lab. Prerequisite: any GEO course.

**HST 203 Judaism/ Christianity/ Islam: Comparative Perspectives.** Prof. Bedford. See REL 203

**HST 243 Ottoman Political and Economic History, 1298-1923.** Prof. Tadros. This course is an intensive survey of Ottoman political and economic history, of an empire that grew from a small principality in the Byzantine and Seljuk marches, to a powerful force in global political and economic affairs. The course will cover Ottoman history from the Byzantine world and its contraction beginning with the rise of Islam, through pre-modern imperialism and conclude with the weakening of the Empire and its final demise between 1914 and 1923. How the Ottoman's were able to rule and maintain a heterogeneous population of Eastern European Christians (Slavs, Greeks, etc.), Anatolian Kurds and Turks, and Arab Christians, Muslims, and Jews, is the central question in our investigation. Prerequisite: Priority to history majors or instructor's permission.

**HST 343 Europe and Islam to Enlightenment.** Prof. Tadros. This course will trace the dynamic relationship between "Europe" and the "Middle East" from the rise of Islam to the Enlightenment. Through philosophical works and travel accounts from the Mediterranean region, students will examine how European and Middle Eastern views of the "other" evolved over time, as the domination of the Mediterranean shifted from East to West. The course will examine the assumptions of the "Clash of Civilizations" theory, illustrating that the complex relationships between West and East depended on the political and economic balance of power between these two regions. Prerequisite: Priority to History Majors any 100 or 200 level course or instructor's permission.

**IDM 325 Entrepreneurship Seminar.** Prof. Fried. The object of the course is to develop business/marketing plans for senior projects in engineering that will explore the potential for commercialization. Interdisciplinary teams will be organized around each senior project. In order to be successful, the engineers will have to communicate the value of their innovative project to social scientists, arts majors and humanists; social scientists, arts majors and humanists will have to communicate the marketing and business strategy to engineers. This course is about interdisciplinary communication, creativity, teamwork, and entrepreneurship. Petition Required.

**MER 302 Engineering Optimization.** Prof. Ramasubramanian. Introduction to development and application of mathematical and numerical methods used to analyze engineering problems including mathematical model building, unconstrained optimization, linear programming, constrained optimization, transformation, nonlinear programming. Prerequisite: CSC 070, MER 201, MER 232.

**MTH 104 Introduction to Statistics- Analysis of Data.** Staff. An introductory course on the concepts and application of probability and the analysis of sampling data. Topics include an introduction to numerical and graphical descriptions of data, probability, random variables, linear regression, sampling theory, and inference. Applicable for Environmental Studies, not open to students who received credit for MTH 052, PSY 200. Petition required.

**PHL 111 Ethics Bowl Practicum.** Prof. Mathias. This practicum provides students the opportunity to further develop their ethical reasoning, critical thinking, and communication skills by participating in the National Intercollegiate Ethics Bowl Program and the Bioethics Bowl. Ethics Bowls are case study competitions that combine the excitement and fun of a competitive quiz with an innovative approach to education in practical and professional ethics. Students enrolled in this course will represent Union College at three events in the 2007-2008 academic years. Petition required.

**PSC 050 Pi Sigma Alpha Journal Practicum.** Prof. Oxley. This course will be designed to provide guidance and hands-on experience for editing a research journal. Students enrolled in the course will be serving on the editorial board of the *Pi Sigma Alpha Undergraduate Journal of Politics*. This journal, sponsored by Pi Sigma Alpha, the national political science honor society, will be hosted by Union College for three years beginning in the Fall of 2007. The journal publishes manuscripts from undergraduate political science students from across the nation. Editorial board membership will be open to all Union members of Pi Sigma Alpha. Prerequisite: Pi Sigma Alpha membership. Petition required.

**PSC 245R Genocide.** Prof. Lobe. This course examines the tragic history, causes, and results of genocide. Attention will be placed on theories that attempt to explain why genocide occurs, the ethical choices and dilemmas of genocidal situations, and solutions that might halt genocidal violence. Some focus will be placed on heroes (rescuers), but the general theme of the course is of unmatched horror and the ability to commit unspeakable deeds. Prerequisite: sophomore standing or PSC 111 or 112. GENED: WAC.

**PSC 256 National Model United Nations- Zambia.** Prof. Watson. The National Model United Nations (NMUN) is one of the most prestigious collegiate conferences in the world. By bringing together over 4000 students from more than 100 colleges and universities around the world, it is also the largest UN simulation in the world. Its goals are to develop diplomatic skills amongst college students while at the same time helping to increase the levels of interaction and interdependence that exist between the academic communities around the world. Students and faculty from five continents work feverishly to propose resolutions addressing regional conflicts, peacekeeping, human rights, woman and children, economic and social development, and the environment. The NMUN programs provide students a better understanding of the inner working of the United Nations and they build skills in diplomacy and compromise. Petition Required.

**PSC 271 Environmental Politics and Law.** Prof. Cusick. This course offers an introduction to U.S. environmental politics as a policy-making process. It also examines the content of laws and policies that this process has produced, with the United States as a principal focus. The course places special emphasis on case studies and specific topics to emphasize the process and alternatives to achieve results. There will be some considerations of international and global issues as well. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing or PSC 111, or 112.

**REL 170 Myth, Ritual and Magic.** Prof. Bedford. **See ANT 170.**

**REL 203 Judaism/Christianity/Islam: Comparative Perspectives.** Prof. Bedford. A comparative study of three great monotheistic traditions. Outlines how each understands its origin and historical development, and also examines the similarities and differences between the three traditions in respect to ideas of God; revelation, scripture and tradition; mysticism; and community and politics.

**SPN 374 Murder, Suicide, and Other Unfortunate events in Spanish and Latin-American Literature.** Prof. Martinez. This course focuses on readings that touch upon different topics from the Civil War in Spain, to social injustice, oppression, and existential angst in Latin America. The course will include plays, short stories and poetry by authors including, Federico Garcia Lorca, Alfonso Sastre, Juan Rulfo, Julio Cortazar, Luis Rafael Sanchez, and Luisa Valenzuela. Prerequisite: SPN 203. GenEd: CDLA

**Practicum Courses** – One course credit is optionally available for participation, after 3 practicum of: Ceramics (AVA 010-030) Choir (AMU016); Orchestra (AMU017); Jazz Ensemble (AMU015); Tap (ADA045); Theater (ATH010); Dance (ADA010-012 – fees applicable); and vocal and instrumental lessons (AMU010 – individual fees). For full details contact Departmental Offices. Please note: ADA 011, 012, 021, 031, 045, 046, 061 are for trained dancers. ADA-010 and ADA-020 are for beginners and ADA 035 ,040, 060 are for students of all levels.

### **ENGLISH DEPARTMENT COURSE CURRICULUM REVISION:**

The English department has made substantial changes to their curriculum effective with the Fall 2006 course offerings. English majors should meet with their advisers to discuss the impact of these changes on their program of study if they have not already done so.

Students wishing to take English courses to satisfy GenEd requirements may take Intermediate Courses after taking one Introductory Course. For most Intermediate Courses, either of the Introductory Courses (EGL 100 or 101) will suffice. **However, during the transition from the old GenEd program to the new core components curriculum, students who have taken *any* English department course will be considered to have met the requirement for an Introductory Course.**

**In Addition** for the class of 2008; any literature course will satisfy the Section I GenEd requirement regardless of the student's history/survey or European/American track.

**Any Gen Ed student** who has not yet taken an English course will need to enroll in Introduction to Literary Studies. Any Gen Ed student who has already taken one English course may enroll in an intermediate (200-level) course. Any Gen Ed student who has already taken two English courses may enroll in an intermediate (200-level) course or a junior seminar (300-level). Senior seminars (400-level) are reserved exclusively for majors.

**MULTIPLE SECTION COURSES: SPECIAL NOTE TO ALL STUDENTS SIGNING UP FOR COURSES WHICH HAVE MULTIPLE SECTIONS, ESPECIALLY IN THE SCIENCES:** Due to the possibility of over and under enrollments in certain sections of multiple section courses, the Registrar's Office, at the request of department chairs, may switch students out of their originally scheduled courses in order to balance the sections.

**CROSS-REFERENCED COURSES:** The first course is the cross-referenced course and the **second** course is the "**Main**" course. Students have the option of signing up for the course under one of the two department headings. If you have a question about the course, or if it is designated as a "petition" course, please see the department that is listed **second (the main course)**.
