Course selections must be made in consultation with faculty advisors. The 2008-09 Academic Register contains full descriptions of courses as well as information on pre-requisites. Additional course descriptions may be found within this document.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM: Courses numbered 0-49 carry no credit. Courses numbered 50-99 are designated for General Education or do not count for the major. Courses numbered 100-199 are all introductory level offerings. Courses numbered 200-299 are those at the sophomore/junior level that may also be taken by non-majors. Courses numbered 300-399 are upper-level that are primarily intended for majors, i.e., which represent the depth component of the major. Courses numbered 400-499 are all advanced level courses for seniors, including those used to fulfill the Senior Writing Experience (WS), seminars, research, thesis and independent studies.

In order to preschedule for winter term classes, each student must follow these steps:

- 1) Create a conflict-free schedule including lab, lecture sections, and alternative choices in the event one of your first three selections is filled. This schedule must be approved as indicated by your **Faculty Advisor's signature** on your "Prescheduling Course Request Form" available in the Registrar's Office **Mon. Oct. 13th**.
- 2) **Petition Course Signup on Web Advising.** If a course is a "petition" course (**indicated by a "Y" in the Petition column** on the course listing), interested students must request a petition, online. Petition sign up days will run **Saturday, October 18th –Tuesday, October 21st**. To make your requests:
 - a. Login on to <https://webadvising.union.edu> and access the student menu.
 - b. Select the "Petition Course Management" option from the registration section.
 - c. Select the 09/WI term and click on Submit.
 - d. On the next screen, your current major on file with the Registrar's Office will be displayed. If it is not correct or if you are anticipating changing your major please put that information in the box labeled "Anticipated Change of Major." Please note: **filling in this box does NOT change your major** with the Registrar. You still need to fill out the appropriate form and obtain appropriate signatures.
 - e. If you are requesting more than one course from a single department and are accepted into more than one, please indicate how many you will actually register for in the appropriate area on the screen.
 - f. In the area marked "New Petitions", enter the subject, course and section numbers in the appropriate boxes. **Only courses that are by petition can be requested on this screen. You will receive an error message if you try to add a non-petition course.**
 - g. In the "Request Status" box, click on the drop down menu and rate your choice (1st, 2nd, 3rd etc.) for each course entered within the same department; if they are from different departments, enter 1st choice.

PLEASE NOTE: For science courses that count towards the GenEd SCLB/SCIE requirement (AST 50, BIO 055, BIO 065 ENS 100, GEO 101, & GEO 109.) **be sure to rate your preference among this group if you ask for more than one.** In the area marked "Why do you need or want this course", please indicate if you need it for GenEd credit (SCLB), or your major or minor.

- h. In the area marked "Why do you want or need this course", please add any comments that will be helpful to the department in determining your acceptance into the course.
- i. Click on Submit at the bottom of the page to complete your petition course request.

3) **Petition Acceptance**

- a. **Monday Oct. 27th - Tuesday Oct. 28th** log back on to <https://webadvising.union.edu> and select “Petition Course Management” to view the courses for which you were approved indicated by the status of “**Faculty Approved**” to the right of the course. Petitions not granted will have the status “Waitlisted” or “Denied.”
- b. Change the status from “**Faculty Approved**” to “**Accepted by Student**”. Remember, this does not automatically register you. **YOU STILL NEED TO REGISTER FOR THIS COURSE during your prescheduling appointment** at Hale House beginning Thursday – October 30th.
- c. If you no longer need the petition, please change the status to “NOT NEEDED”.
- d. Online petitions will be invalidated after **Friday, November 7th**.

If you run into any problems with signup for petition courses please contact the department secretary within the specific department.

4) **Prescheduling:**

- a. Prescheduling will be conducted by appointment via the web in Hale House Dining Room **Thursday, Oct. 30th –Wednesday, Nov. 5th**. **Please refer to your prescheduling sheet available in the Registrar’s office starting Monday, Oct 13th, for your specific appointment day and time.**
- b. **Your prescheduling sheet must be relinquished to a member of the Registrar’s staff before leaving Hale House.** The last day to preschedule is **Friday Nov 7th at Silliman Hall**. Students wishing to add or change courses after this date will need to wait until the first day of winter term, Monday, January 5th.

Students who do not plan to return to Union for the Winter Term, except for seniors who are completing their requirements early, should immediately NOTIFY the Dean of Students Office. Students who will be on a Union College term abroad for the Winter Term **DO NOT** need to preschedule their courses.

Fourth Course Policy

The annual tuition at Union allows a student to register for three terms taking three courses per term. This allows students to complete the required 36 courses for graduation. In some Engineering programs as many as 40 courses may be required and those students are permitted to enroll in 10 courses per year. Under certain circumstances students may be allowed to take a fourth course in a term.

Students who are making satisfactory progress in their program of study are allowed to enroll in one fourth course during an academic year at no extra charge, provided they have a GPA of at least 3.3. These courses can be used to enhance the student's academic experience at Union. All such courses will appear on the transcript and can be used to fulfill program requirements; however, they can not be used for the purpose of accelerated graduation. (This includes fourth courses taken on a Term Abroad.)

Fourth courses can also be used to make up a deficiency in credits due to withdrawals or failure or if a student does not have the requisite GPA. A 4th course fee will be charged under these circumstances (for 2008-2009 the fee will be approximately \$2,856). Students whose GPA is below 2.5 will need the written permission of Dean Bidoshi before signing up for a fourth course.

All students, including engineering students, with the exception of Leadership in Medicine (LIM) and Scholar Students will be required to fill out the "Petition to Enroll in a Fourth Course" form. ***** DESCRIPTIONS OF COURSES NOT IN THE
2008-2009 ACADEMIC REGISTER *****

ADA 070 Choreography: Modern Dance Practicum. Prof. M. Moutillet. This class will give students the opportunity to participate in the creation of a dance piece. We will focus on the post-modern era and its dance vocabulary by rehearsing cumulative movements, 1960s-80s music, and the integration of multi-media. Each week the class will build on created material which will ultimately lead to the completion of a dance work to be presented as part of the Winter Dance Concert 2008. Prerequisite: Student must be intermediate or advance student in dance. Petition Required.

ADA 071 Choreography: Jazz Practicum. M. Rogers. This class offers students the chance to be a part of a dance creation. Each week the class will participate in the composition of an innovative dance utilizing the jazz form. This class will primarily focus upon the post-modern dance vocabulary of the 1960s-1980s. Through participation in this class, students will explore a wide range of intricate and innovative movements as a means of self-expression and individual study. The result will be presented as part of the Winter Dance Concert 2008. Prerequisite: Dancers must be intermediate or advance level. Petition Required.

ANT 194 India Through Film and Novel. Prof. A. DeNicola. Beginning with and focusing on the colonial period, this course explores popular depictions of India up through present day novels and Hollywood films. In the process the course also questions the role – both the problems and possibilities – of Indian film and novels as tools for cultural analysis in the postcolonial period. Finally, the course explores the question of authorship by comparing “colonial” literature with “native” literature to question whether there are clear dichotomies between such categories. LCC.

ANT 270 Political Anthropology. Prof. J. Witsoe. The course introduces anthropological approaches to the study of politics. We will examine influential theories of power, democracy and the state and how these have been applied to specific cases studies. The course will examine: local politics, democratic elections, bureaucracy and other state institutions, and political implications of development practice. We end by exploring the implications of globalization for studying politics and the state. LCC

ATH 235 Physical Theater. Prof. M. Moutillet. This course emphasizes the development of the actor’s body as an expressive instrument. Primary focus is on the actor’s physical presence, actions over language, and use of gestures. Actors will be trained in techniques that focus on the building of strength and flexibility, improvisation targeting relationships and interplay between performers, and visual elements to create scenic imagery. This course will pursue a wide range of styles, approaches and aesthetics including dance-theatre, movement theatre, mime, mask, and use of a live camera to project actor actions and interactions with props and scenery. We will review contemporary European, Japanese and American styles of physical expression to broaden theatrical actions. The class work will culminate in a collaborative creation produced and performed at the Yulman Theatre in the Winter Dance Concert 2009. No prerequisite. Petition Required.

BIO 204 Epigenetics and Human Diseases. Prof. Q. Chu-LaGraff. This course will focus on the epigenetic phenomenon (e.g. RNA interference and genomic imprinting) on development, embryonic stem cells, animal cloning, and heritable human diseases. Epigenetic patterns are changes in gene expression that does not involve changes in DNA sequences. Epigenetic gene regulations are important during animal and plant development, particularly in the repression of specific genotype which includes X-chromosome inactivation and gene silencing. Topics such as genomic imprinting, epigenetic effects in Assisted Reproductive Technology such as in vitro fertilization, will also be discussed. Students will be expected to develop skills in critical thinking, writing, and oral presentations through in-depth reading of primary research and review papers on these topics. Petition Required.

BIO 488 Topics in Organismal Biology. Prof. B. Boyer. This course will focus on the role of toxic chemicals in human reproduction and development. Particular emphasis will be on endocrine disruptors, chemicals that mimic or block the function of hormones and are found in all of us. As stated in the Feb. 4 issue of *Newsweek*, " . . . we're now awash in a chemical brew of hormone-mimicking compounds that didn't exist 100 years ago." We will consider the mechanisms of action and health effects of human and animal exposure to a number of these chemicals, including abnormalities of development, growth reproduction, impaired function of the immune and nervous systems and cancer. Petition Required.

CHM 291/292/293 Research Practicum. Staff. This course is designed for students who want to gain research experience in chemistry under the direction of a member of the faculty. Expectations include a minimum of four hours per week of lab work, attendance at the weekly Chemistry Department seminar and presentation of research results at the Steinmetz Symposium, in addition to other requirements to be determined by individual research advisors. To receive Pass/Fail credit equivalent to one course, the student must earn three terms (normally in a row) of passing grades for the practicum experience. Not open to students currently enrolled in CHM 491, 492, 493 or in a sophomore scholars project in the Chemistry Department. There is no syllabus or text for this course. No letter grade will be given. Readings will be at the discretion of the research advisor.

CSC 225 Introduction to Robotics. Prof. L. Almstead. This course will provide an introduction to robotics. Students will examine the hardware used in mobile robots and the algorithms necessary for navigation, control, and managing multiple behaviors. Students will write and test software on several robot platforms. We will also explore robotic vision, speech synthesis and social robotics. Prerequisite: Any 100 level CS intro course (103-109).

GER 338/MLT 236 Poetry, Performance & Protest. Prof. E. Nelson. This course explores the legacy of 20th Century German literature and cultural history through its poetic tradition of performance and protest, with special focus given to shifts in presentations and understandings of class, gender, racial, and generational power relations amid the political, social, and cultural realities of the time. Prerequisite: None for MLT. GER 201 for Ger 338. LCC.

HST 136 Middle East to 1800. Prof. M. Tadros. This course is designed to enrich the students' historical awareness of a region that for millennia has served as a crossroads of cultural and economic exchange. Throughout our period of study, this region of southwest Asia and northern Africa was home to a multiplicity of religions, languages, ethnicities, and human activities. Relative to other settled areas, this heterogeneous conglomeration was unique to the Middle East. This course, encompassing more than a thousand years of history, aims to familiarize students with the various cultural (including social, economic, and political) developments of the region from the sixth century to the eighteenth century, and, is intended to serve as a catalyst for further study of Middle Eastern history.

HST 184 Making of Modern India 1800-1947. Prof. S. Paik. To examine the history of South Asia since 1880. We will concentrate on the impact of colonialism on the Indian subcontinent and on the formation of the modern South Asian States of India and Pakistan. The culture of colonialism, the nature of the colonial state and the emergence of nationalism are themes which are explored. Thematically, this course explores the making of modern Indian subcontinent in the course of interaction with colonial 'modernity' and the birth of organized nationalist movement. Chronologically, we will survey the history of Indian subcontinent from the inception of colonial rule in the late eighteenth century to the establishment of independent nation states of India and Pakistan in the middle of the twentieth century. LCC

HST 244 History of Christianity. Prof. P. Bedford. The 2000 year history of Christianity is entwined with European history and, over the past few hundred years, World history. This course examines the key figures, events and ideas of Christian history and also reflects on how modern forms of Christianity have responded to changing currents in politics, social values, and critical thought.

PHL 231 Symbolic Logic. Prof. M. Wunderlich. A course in first-order logic using Allen and Hand's deduction system.

PHL 446 Topics in Epistemology: Experimental Philosophy. Prof. M. Wunderlich. A survey of contemporary issues in epistemology that is relevant to 'experimental philosophy.' Among the topics to be considered are the methodological presuppositions that bear on gathering data on intuitions and the place of experimental philosophy in naturalized epistemology. Prerequisites: 2 Philosophy courses or permission of the instructor.

PHL 450 Topics in the History of Philosophy: Empiricism – Then and Now. Prof. R. Martin. In the first three fourths of the course, we will study the original writings of traditional British Empiricists: primarily Locke, Berkeley, and Hume. In the last fourth, we will look at Bas van Fraassen's recent defense of empiricism. Van Fraassen is a philosopher at Princeton and one of the foremost contemporary philosophers of science. If we have time, we may also consider some of the spirited response that van Fraassen's defense of empiricism has provoked from other philosophers. This course counts toward satisfying the Philosophy Department's history of philosophy requirement for majors. Prerequisites: 2 Philosophy courses or permission of the instructor.

PSC 285 Electoral Reform. Prof. C. Brown. This course will examine the structure and practices of the presidential election process (both nomination and general election) with a view to analyzing the political implications of several proposed reform alternatives. Topics covered will include, among others, Electoral College reform, nomination process reform, campaign finance reform, and reforming the ways in which voters receive information. The primary purpose of the course will be to develop a greater student understanding of how the current presidential selection system works, where it fails to achieve generally accepted political norms, ways in which it might be changed to achieve those norms, and the possible range of consequences (intended and "unintended") that would accompany reform. Prerequisites: PSC 111 or PSC 112 or sophomore standing.

PSY 420 Seminar in Learning and Memory: Intuition, Decision-Making, and Cognitive Illusions. Prof. C. Chabris. An examination of the ways in which human thinking departs from the ideal of objective, rational decision-making, and the reasons why this happens. Specific topics will include the role of intuition, the effects of context, and illusions and misbeliefs that we hold about how our minds work. Petition required.

PSY 430 Seminar in Social Psychology: Stereotypes, Prejudice & Discrimination. Prof. T. Robbins. This seminar will explore the causes and consequences of stereotypes, prejudice, and discrimination from a social psychological perspective. We will examine the functions of prejudice, the formation and maintenance of prejudice, and strategies for reducing prejudice. We will review classic and contemporary literature on these topics and explore cutting-edge research in the area. Petition required.

REL 215 Introduction to Eco-Theology: Religion and Nature. Dr. H. Margulies. This course examines prominent religious and ethical worldviews (Dialogical, Zen-Buddhist, Biblical, organic, mechanistic, preservationist, conservationist, spiritual and secular stewardship, for example) that have guided human action toward the natural world. We will review issues in environmental ethics and policy within a context that includes religious approaches to environmental philosophy and ecological theology. We will place particular attention at how environmental policy is approached, defined and applied in some of the poorer and post-colonial nations of the third world (primarily in Latin America). We will compare philosophical and theological assumptions underlying the connections between nature and culture in American ecological thought, in the West in general, in the traditions stemming from Eastern spirituality and in the Third World.

REL 340 Reading the Rabbis: Classical Rabbinic Literature and Theology. Prof. P. Bedford. The central texts of the Classical period of Rabbinic Judaism—Mishnah, Midrash, Talmud—are fundamental to an understanding of Jewish thought and religion. This course examines these texts and their interpretation, discussing matters of genre, structure and development, historical and social contexts of their production, and how they inform us of rabbinic worldview, culture, theology and hermeneutics. Prerequisite: REL 103 or HST 203 or permission of instructor.

Understanding the New General Education distribution requirements

First-Year Preceptorial and Sophomore Research Seminar - First-year students will be assigned to an FPR section during the Fall or Winter term of their first year.

- Sophomores will be assigned to an SRS in one term during their sophomore year.
- Note that neither FPR nor SRS will be credited toward any major or minor.

Social Sciences (1) - Any course listed in a Social Sciences department will satisfy the Social Sciences distribution requirement.

Humanities (2) one must be a literature course.

- Any course listed in a Humanities department will satisfy the Humanities distribution requirement.
- Any MLT course will satisfy the literature requirement.
- Any course previously assigned "L" (AML, AMLS, ANL, ANLS, EUL, EULS) will satisfy the Literature requirement under the Humanities distribution requirement.

Linguistic and Cultural Competency (2)

- Any sequence of two courses in one foreign language at level 101 or higher will satisfy the LCC requirement.
- Any course previously assigned CDAA, CDEA or CDLA, or any course carrying the new LCC designation will count toward the LCC requirement.
- Any full term abroad will satisfy both LCC requirements. A mini-term satisfies both LCC requirements only if it is associated with an on-campus pre- and/or post-term seminar.

Quantitative and Mathematical Reasoning (1)

- Any course previously carrying the MATH designation or carrying the QMR designation will satisfy the QMR requirement.

Science and Technology (2)

- Any course listed as SCLB (whether counted toward the major or not) will satisfy the Science with Lab requirement.
- Any course previously carrying the SCIE, SCLB, SCMJ or SCMT designations or listed by a department in Division 4, or carrying the new ST designation will satisfy the second Science/Technology requirement.

Clusters

- Any three courses in an approved cluster, from at least 2 different departments satisfy the Cluster requirement. Information about clusters may be found at:

MULTIPLE SECTION COURSES: SPECIAL NOTE TO ALL STUDENTS SIGNING UP FOR COURSES WHICH HAVE MULTIPLE SECTIONS, ESPECIALLY IN THE SCIENCES: Due to the possibility of over and under enrollments in certain sections of multiple section courses, the Registrar's Office, at the request of department chairs, may switch students out of their originally scheduled courses in order to balance the sections.
