Course selections must be made in consultation with faculty advisors. The 2008-09 Academic Register gives full descriptions of courses as well as information on prerequisites. Additional course descriptions may be found within this document.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM: Courses numbered 0-49 will be those that carry no credit. Courses numbered 50-99 are designated for General Education or other courses that do not count for the major. Courses numbered 100-199 are all introductory level offerings. Courses numbered 200-299 are those at the sophomore/junior level that may also be taken by non-majors. Courses numbered 300-399 are upper-level which are primarily intended for majors, i.e. courses which represent the depth component of the major. Courses numbered 400-499 are all advanced level courses for seniors, including those used to fulfill the Senior Writing Experience (WS), seminars, research, thesis and independent studies.

COURSE LOAD: Written Permission from your advisor is required and must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar when taking less than the normal course load [three (3) courses] per term. Please see Page 2 for information regarding fourth courses.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES: Students who have not taken a language course at Union must check with the Modern Languages department for placement into the appropriate course/level. A placement recommendation form will be provided that must be brought to the Registrar during add/drop. For information on prerequisites, please refer to the catalog. No student will be allowed to register for a language course unless they:

- 1) have a signed placement recommendation form or
- 2) have taken the prerequisite course **here at Union**.

DISCLOSURE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION: Union College hereby designates the following student information as public or "Directory Information." Such information may be disclosed by the institution for any purpose, at its discretion:

Fourth Course Policy

The annual tuition at Union allows a student to register for three terms taking three courses per term. This allows students to complete the required 36 courses for graduation. In some Engineering programs as many as 40 courses may be required and those students are permitted to enroll in 10 courses per year. Under certain circumstances students may be allowed to take a fourth course in a term.

Students who are making satisfactory progress in their program of study are allowed to enroll in one fourth course during an academic year at no extra charge, provided they have a GPA of at least 3.3. These courses can be used to enhance the student's academic experience at Union. All such courses will appear on the transcript and can be used to fulfill program requirements; however, they can not be used for the purpose of accelerated graduation. (This includes fourth courses taken on a Term Abroad.)

Fourth courses can also be used to make up a deficiency in credits due to withdrawals or failure or if a student does not have the requisite GPA. A 4th course fee will be charged under these circumstances (for 2008-2009 the fee will be approximately \$2,856). Students whose GPA is below 2.5 will need the written permission of Dean Bidoshi before signing up for a fourth course.

All students, including engineering students, with the exception of Leadership in Medicine (LIM) and Scholar Students will be required to fill out the "Petition to Enroll in a Fourth Course" form. CROSS REGISTRATION

Please Note: Union College and *Union Graduate College are two separate Colleges. All graduate level courses taken by Union undergraduates, including Leadership in Medicine and Combined Degree students will be taken through Union Graduate College and will require completion of a special “Union Graduate College” Cross Registration Form. These forms are available in the Registrar’s Office in Silliman Hall.

*** DESCRIPTION OF COURSES NOT IN THE
2008-2009 ACADEMIC REGISTER ***

ADA 022 Lyrical Jazz. M. Rogers. The lyrical jazz dance class will meet once a week for an hour and fifteen minutes. Each week the class will begin with a warm up, followed by technical combinations and progressions, and finishing with a combination. This class will primarily focus upon dancing ones emotions gained from the music they are dancing to. Although one may not relate to a song literally, they will learn to draw from their own life experience, thus providing a much more fulfilling dance experience. In this therapeutic class, dancers will learn metaphorical and symbolic movements to convey emotions such as sadness, happiness, hope, joy, heart-ache, euphoria, and more. This class is geared towards the Intermediate and Advance Level dancer looking to broaden his or her horizons with this new-age dance style.

ANT 210 Anthropology of Poverty. J. Witsoe. Why has urban poverty remained so entrenched in the United States, even amidst the unprecedented economic expansion of the post-war period? This course will seek to answer this question by exploring the relationships between race, public institutions, economic change and inequality within American society. In doing so, the course will examine the theoretical approaches for understanding the persistence of poverty in the United States, as well as the major policy frameworks that seek to reduce poverty. In addition, the course will cover anthropological critiques of these approaches and anthropological accounts of the everyday realities and struggles of poor people. The most important component of the course will involve student internships with local poverty-related organizations. These internships will provide substantial ethnographic experience to supplement course readings and will add practical insights to class discussions. By the end of the course, students should have theoretical, historical and ethnographic understanding of the dynamics of poverty in the United States, and a sense of the ways in which anthropology can contribute to key policy debates and public activism related to poverty. ANT 265/HST 191 The Museum: Theory & Practice. A. DeNicola. This seminar examines the role of the museum through readings, fieldtrips, and a student internship at the Schenectady Museum. Topics covered include the historical development of the museum, issues in the representation of culture, public history debates, the repatriation of Native American artifacts, and exhibit design. Students spend 6 to 8 hours interning and 1 to 2 hours in seminar each week. Petition required.

ANT 274/AMU 220 Music and Culture. J. M. Matsue. Introduces students to the discipline of ethnomusicology, with particular emphasis on ethnographic methods, through readings on the history and development of the field, considering the major theoretical approaches, and supplemented by readings on specific world music areas. Students will conduct an extensive fieldwork project on music-making in the community. Pre-requisite: Petition required. LCC/WAC

ANT 280 India: Paradoxes of the 21st Century. J. Witsoe. This course will focus on the paradoxes of contemporary India. The second-fastest growing major economy in the world, India is also a country with hundreds of millions of people living in extreme poverty. Arguably the most successful democracy in the postcolonial world, Indian politics is also pervaded by corruption and violence. Combining political economy readings with ethnographic accounts, the course will examine recent political developments in India such as the rise of Hindu nationalism, the spread of lower-caste politics, and economic liberalization. We focus on the challenges that India faces in the twenty-first century, including land and water scarcities, the already visible effects of global warming, and growing inequalities between regions and social groups. This will add complexity and balance to the now widespread image of India as a rising economic superpower within an emergent "Asian Century." By the end of the course, students will be well acquainted with the major areas of anthropological inquiry in India, have a good sense of the directions that the field is moving, and will have a good understanding of the major cultural, political, and economic developments that are shaping contemporary India. LCC

AVA 400 Photography 4 Special Projects. M. Benjamin. Continuation in advanced photography with emphasis on creating work from original ideas, along with examination of contemporary trends in art and photography. Students choose black & white darkroom or color digital to execute a 10-week project about a specific theme or topic. Digital or film camera required. Petition required.

CHM 293 Research Practicum 3. Staff. This course is designed for students who want to gain research experience in chemistry under the direction of a member of the faculty. Expectations include a minimum of four hours per week of lab work, attendance at the weekly Chemistry Department seminar and presentation of research results at the Steinmetz Symposium, in addition to other requirements to be determined by individual research advisors. To receive Pass/Fail credit equivalent to one course, the student must earn three terms (normally in a row) of passing grades for the practicum experience. Not open to students currently enrolled in CHM 491, 492, 493 or in a sophomore scholar's project in the Chemistry Department. There is no syllabus or text for this course. No letter grade will be given. Readings will be at the discretion of the research advisor.

CLS 111 Ancient Iraq – History & Religion. P. Bedford. Ancient Iraq is often termed “the cradle of civilization” since it is here that agriculture, urbanism, and writing first occurred. This course examines the early history of Iraq (ancient Mesopotamia) from the development of agriculture and permanent settlements through to the establishment of the first cities and states, down to about 2000 BCE. The class examines the social and economic contexts in which early Mesopotamian culture emerged, and it also gives attention to religious and religious-political ideas. ANCS

CLS 320/REL 320 Early Christian Thought: From Paul to Augustine. P. Bedford. Christianity emerged in the context of late antique Greco-Roman culture with its roots in ancient Judaism. It drew on both of these in developing its distinctive teachings regarding Christ, God, salvation, the church, ethics, and society. This course examines how over the period 50-450 CE debates around these topics led to the articulation of the normative Christian tradition.

ECE-281/282/283 ECE Practicum. Staff. Under the supervision of an ECE faculty member, students may participate in undergraduate research or a design project. To receive pass/fail credit equivalent to one elective course, a student must receive a passing grade in three terms of the practicum course. Up to two credits may be earned in this way. Pre-requisite: Permission of the faculty and the department chair is required.

ECE-325 Acoustics of Speech Communication. H. Hanson. Acoustics, circuit theory, and signal processing applied to analysis of speech signals; Physiology of speech production; Articulatory phonetics; Acoustical and articulatory description of phonetic features and of prosodic aspects of speech; Perception of speech; Models of speech production and planning; Some applications to recognition and generation of speech by machine, and to the study of speech disorders. Prerequisite: ECE-241

ECO 227 Topics in Labor. M. Asali. Introduces basic tools used in labor market analyses, such as labor supply (by workers) and labor demand (by firms). Through the interaction of labor supply and labor demand, we want to understand the market process of wage and employment determination; to analyze the effect of labor market imperfections and government policies (such as minimum wage, and affirmative action) on wages and employment; and to be able to combine formal behavioral models with empirical evidence to explain and predict various labor market phenomena. Topics of main interest in this course will include immigration and labor market discrimination. Prerequisite: ECO-101. Not open to Jrs. Or Srs. who are Economics or ID Economic majors.

GEO 206 Watershed Hydrology w/Lab. J. Cockburn. This course is a practical discussion of the physical processes of surface water formation and the fluvial environment with emphasis on mid-latitude and northern examples. Watershed hydrology will be presented as a basis for studying the spatial and temporal characteristics of surface water environments through lectures, field work and laboratory data analysis. Petition required.

GER 304 German Fairy Tales, Folklore, Fantasy, (Märchen und Kunstmärchen). E. Nelson. In this course we will examine the tradition of the German Fairy Tale and discuss the historical basis of this popular genre of literature, its reception within different cultural frameworks, and its influence on later literature of the nineteenth, twentieth and

twenty-first centuries. Lectures and discussions will focus on identifying aesthetic, sociological, psychological, and psychoanalytical Implications and gender issues. The Grimm Brothers' Kinder- und Hausmarchen (and their revisions in popular and literary culture) will provide a basis for discussing the fairy tale's role in culture and its continued vitality in the different cultural frameworks of classical, romantic, and modern fantastic tales by Goethe, Tieck, Hofmannsthal, Kafka, and Kurt. Prerequisite: GER-201 or permission of the instructor.

HST 202 Slavery in African History. B. Peterson. This course explores slavery and the slave trade from the perspective of Africa. It assesses the impact of the slave trade on Africa. Topics include wars of enslavement, Islam and slavery, gender, the middle passage, religion, slave narratives, rebellion and resistance, abolition and the legacy of slavery. Although the focus will be primarily on the Atlantic slave trade, comparative case study examples from the Trans-Saharan and Indian Ocean trades will also be examined. CDAA/LCC

HST 252 France 1515-1714. M. Tadros. From the accession to the throne by Francis I, through the reign of Louis XIV, we will investigate the mental constructs and motivations of the French monarchs and the people they governed. During this period France was embroiled in domestic and European-wide conflicts stemming from dynastic and religio-political controversies. The impact of these conflicts on the French population is a central theme of this course. We will also consider the relationships between the three estates of French society - the Church, nobility, and commoners-and their contributions to French culture. The history of France will be rendered from not only the perspective of the elite, but also of "le peuple." Moreover, we will analyze the centralizing elements and consolidation of power that led to an "absolutist" state during Louis XIV's monarchy. WAC

IDM 202 Digital Filmmaking: From Story to Screen. J. de Seve. This intensive hands-on class guides students from concept to finished film. Students practice the essentials of filmmaking technique, including storytelling, camera work, lighting, sound and editing. Students must be up for a challenging schedule and will make a film each week as they explore the nuts and bolts of moviemaking. Petition Required

IDM 260 Social Entrepreneurship. H. Fried. Entrepreneurs identify opportunities, mobilize resources and make things happen. This course applies the active mindset of the entrepreneur to social organizations. The measure of success is not profit, but change. Passion and mission are the motivators. Examples include feeding the hungry, improving the environment, educating the destitute, housing the poor, training the unskilled, caring for the disenfranchised sick, and much more. Jeroo Billimoria founded Child line in Mumbai, India that provides services to street children. Veronica Khosa founded Tateni that works with aids victims in South Africa. Jacob Schramm founded College Summit to make college accessible to low-income students in the U.S. And the list goes on. In the course, we will study many examples of social entrepreneurship, identify best and worst practices, work with local social entrepreneurial organizations and identify opportunities to make the world a better place.

MER 354 Advanced Materials. R. Cortez. Focuses on the properties and applications of materials. Several advanced materials, currently in the research and development stage, will also be introduced with a discussion of the needed infrastructure to bring the materials to production. Topics include composites, engineering alloys, microelectromechanical systems (MEMS) devices, nanomaterials, semiconductors and microelectronic fabrication, and superconductors. Prerequisite: MER213 or by permission of the instructor.

MTH 061 Math in Public Interest. K. Plofker. What post-high school mathematics do non-scientists most need to understand, in order to make intelligent decisions about quantitative matters as individuals and as citizens? In what ways do advertisers, politicians, and other propagandists try to trick the public by exploiting our ignorance of or aversion to mathematical reasoning? "Mathematics in the Public Interest" explores key mathematical topics including statistics, probability, exponential and logarithmic functions, and visual/graphical representation of numbers, in the context of contemporary public policy issues such as the 2008 financial crisis, gaming institutions, population demographics, and climate change. We will apply the mathematics learned in the course to analyzing quantitative claims in commerce, the media and other popular sources. In the process, students will develop general "defensive numeracy" skills for critical thinking about the use and misuse of mathematical arguments. Petition Required. MATH

MTH 470 Category Theory. S. Niefield. An introduction to category theory including categories, functors, natural transformations, duality, monomorphisms, epimorphisms, isomorphisms, equivalence/ isomorphism of categories, universal properties and adjoint functors. Petition Required.

PHL 167 Chinese Philosophy. L. Patrik. This is an introductory survey of philosophical theories developed in ancient China. It includes study of the six traditional schools of Chinese philosophy—Confucianism, Daoism, Moism, Yin/Yang, Legalism and School of Names—as well as philosophical theories important in China's later history, such as Buddhism, Neo-Confucianism and Neo-Daoism. Chinese philosophers investigated the nature of reality and mind, but they also anchored their theories in concrete, practical reflections on social structures that promote individual well-being and social harmony. Many of the Chinese philosophies proposed the model of the sage, someone who develops wisdom by raising questions about what is most meaningful in human life. CDEA

PHL 450: Topics in the History of Philosophy: Metaphysics: The Developing Tradition. L. Warenski. This course is an advanced-level introduction to metaphysics, one of the oldest and most diverse areas of philosophy. Metaphysics might be described as the philosophical investigation of the fundamental nature and structure of reality. The questions of metaphysics are basic philosophical questions such as, What exists? What is the nature of causation? Is time real? Could things have been different than the way they are? Is reality, generally, different from how things appear to be? In this course, we will examine the historical origins of these questions and how history has shaped current philosophical debate. WAC.

PSC 245 Populisms. G. Seri. Democracy has come to Latin America to stay. But so have characterizations of political leadership and politics in the region as populist, especially in the eyes of outside observers. But, what is populism? Claimed by no one, most of the time, populism is blamed, disapprovingly, upon leaders and movements connoting demagoguery and manipulative appeals to people's emotions and disregard for formal institutions and rules. Still, are these clearly identifiable traits of a specific type of politics—populism—or they constitute moments, and dangers, embedded in democratic politics as such? This course scrutinizes three different moments in the history of the concept, starting in the first half of the 20th century and ending with the interrogation of present-day politics in Latin America. Major figures such as Juan Domingo Perón or Getulio Vargas, but also neoliberal reformers from the 1990s, from Alberto Fujimori to Carlos Menem, as well as current leaders such as Hugo Chavez, Evo Morales, and Rafael Correa will be examined in light of different concepts and arguments, with the goal to elucidate whether Populism constitutes a rigorous category within political science, or it belongs to the “I know it when I see it” tradition of disqualifying the other's politics. Prerequisites: SO standing or PSC-111 or PSC-112.

PSY 345 Women and Psychology. G. Donaldson. This is a course about women as objects of psychological investigation, both past and present, and about women as psychologists. It is not a course about the psychology of women, but rather asks the question: Is there such a thing as a “psychology of women?” By looking at the various ways that psychology and psychiatry have attempted to investigate the minds and experiences of women in the past and in modern times we will try to answer that question. Petition Required.

REL320/CLS320 Early Christian Thought: Paul to Augustine. P. Bedford. Christianity emerged in the context of late antique Greco-Roman culture with its roots in ancient Judaism. It drew on both of these in developing its distinctive teachings regarding Christ, God, salvation, the church, ethics, and society. This course examines how over the period 50-450 CE debates around these topics led to the articulation of the normative Christian tradition.

SPN 307 Fiction2.0 ContemSpnNarrative. C. Henseler. In this course we will examine the literary production of the "Nocilla Generation," also known as the "Millennials," "Generation Y," or "Generation Net" This group of writers was born after 1970 and began to publish at the turn of the century, They explore a new, global cultural landscape characterized by the convergence of media technologies and popular cultures, In this course we will examine two hybrid manifestations: the novel *Nocilla Dream* (2006) by Agustín Fernández Mallo and *Atico* (2004) by Gabi Martínez, We will explore how the concept of Web 2.0, and its outgrowths in hypermedia and digital video games, has determined Spanish storytelling techniques (and questioned age-old relations between authors-characters-readers),

As a class we will use Wikispaces to share and deepen our critical and creative thinking about the subject.

Prerequisite: SPN 203 GenEd: WAC

SPN 309 Golden Age Spanish Theatre. S. Triplette. In 16th and 17th century Spain, theatrical productions, called comedias, were an extremely popular form of public entertainment. Many of the most celebrated literary figures of Golden Age Spain had theatrical ambitions, and comedias ranged in theme and tone from the stately and philosophical to the downright farcical. This course focuses on a set of well-known plays that feature prominent female characters. These plays meditate on the role of women both on the stage and in society as a whole. Most depict strong women characters that transcend their prescribed social roles. Some of the women behave “like men,” even to the point of dressing like them, and we will use these theatrical works to examine the double standard that defined acceptable behavior for each gender. Prerequisites: SPN 203 or permission from the instructor. LCC/WAC

Understanding the New General Education distribution requirements

First-Year Preceptorial and Sophomore Research Seminar - First-year students will be assigned to an FPR section one term during their first year.

- Sophomores will be assigned to an SRS in one term during their sophomore year.
- Note that neither FPR nor SRS will be credited toward any major or minor.

Social Sciences (1) - Any course listed in a Social Sciences department will satisfy the Social Sciences distribution requirement.

Humanities (2) one must be a literature course.

- Any course listed in a Humanities department will satisfy the Humanities distribution requirement.
- Any MLT course will satisfy the literature requirement.
- Any course previously assigned “L” (AML, AMLS, ANL, ANLS, EUL, EULS) will satisfy the Literature requirement under the Humanities distribution requirement.

Linguistic and Cultural Competency (2)

- Any sequence of two courses in one foreign language at level 101 or higher will satisfy the LCC requirement.
- Any course previously assigned CDAA, CDEA or CDLA, or any course carrying the new LCC designation will count toward the LCC requirement.
- Any full term abroad will satisfy both LCC requirements. A mini-term satisfies both LCC requirements only if it is associated with an on-campus pre- and/or post-term seminar.

Quantitative and Mathematical Reasoning (1)

- Any course previously carrying the MATH designation or carrying the QMR designation will satisfy the QMR requirement.

Science and Technology (2)

- Any course listed as SCLB (whether counted toward the major or not) will satisfy the Science with Lab requirement.
- Any course previously carrying the SCIE, SCLB, SCMJ or SCMT designations or listed by a department in Division 4, or carrying the new ST designation will satisfy the second Science/Technology requirement.

Clusters
