

- In spring of their first year, students will express their preferences for their SRS section, and will be assigned to an SRS in one term during their sophomore year. (Note that Union Scholars take their Scholars Research Seminar in their first year.)
- Neither FPR nor SRS will be credited toward any major or minor.

Part B: Distribution

Students are encouraged to select courses in Part B (Distribution) which help them build a cluster (Part C). Overlap between Parts B and C is allowed and encouraged.

Social Sciences (1)

- Any course listed in a Social Sciences department (Anthropology, Economics, History, Political Science, & Sociology) or PSY-100 will satisfy the Social Sciences distribution requirement.

Humanities (2) one must be a literature course.

- Any course listed in a Humanities department (Classics, English, Modern Languages, Music, Philosophy, Theater and Dance, Visual Arts) will satisfy the Humanities distribution requirement.
- Any English or MLT course will satisfy the literature requirement.
- Any *other* course carrying the “HUL” (Humanities – Lit) designation will satisfy the Literature requirement under the Humanities distribution requirement.

Linguistic and Cultural Competency (2)

- Two courses to demonstrate Linguistic and Cultural Competency. This requirement can be satisfied in one of three ways:
 - a sequence of two courses in one foreign language at level 101 or higher
 - any two courses designated “LCC”
 - term abroad courses (including international and the Community Service and Civil Rights mini-terms)

Quantitative and Mathematical Reasoning (1)

- One course to demonstrate quantitative and mathematical reasoning includes courses in the Math department or those offered in any other department carrying the “QMR” designation. Note that Math 100 alone does not fulfill the requirement; it must be taken with Math 101 to satisfy QMR.

Science and Technology (2)

- One course in natural sciences, with lab, listed as “SCLB”
- One course selected from the following categories:
 - a second science course (need not have a lab)
 - a course from engineering or computer science, to foster understanding of technology
 - a team-taught ID course (including at least one faculty from Division 3 or 4), with significant science or engineering content, about the impact of science and/or technology on the human world, listed as “SET” (Science/ Engineering/ Technology).

Part C: Connections across Disciplines (Clusters)

- Clusters prompt awareness of interdisciplinary connections by requiring students to take three courses in an approved cluster, from at least two different departments. Students may automatically satisfy the Cluster requirement by completing either a major or a minor in any interdisciplinary or organizing theme program. Students are permitted to include one course from the department of their major (one from each department if they are interdepartmental or double majors).
- Beginning in 2011-12, students may also work with their advisors to create a Student-Organized Clusters (STOC). A STOC should follow the normal guidelines for clusters: courses which relate to a common theme from two or more departments, no more than one from the department of the major (one from each department for interdepartmental or double majors). Note that the STOC should be defined, and approved by the student’s advisor, by the end of the junior year.

Declaration of Cluster: Students should indicate how they plan to complete the cluster requirement no later than the end of their sophomore year. This can be done through the Web Advising system (<https://webadvising.union.edu>) through a drop-down menu on the Cluster Selection page. Students may change their choice at any time. Note that students may opt for the student-organized cluster, and have until the end of the junior year to have their course selection approved by their advisors. Advisors will see the student’s cluster choice listed under the major and minor information on their Web Advising screen.

Writing Across the Curriculum (WAC): There are three components of WAC built into your curriculum. The first is in Part A of the Gen Ed curriculum above (First-Year Preceptorial and the Sophomore (or Scholars) Research Seminar). The second is enrolling in at least five courses (in two different divisions) designated “WAC.” The third is a capstone senior writing experience (thesis or research seminar, designated WS), generally done as part of your major. Fourth Course Policy

The annual tuition at Union allows a student to register for three terms taking three courses per term. This allows students to complete the required 36 courses for graduation. In some Engineering programs as many as 40 courses may be required and those students are permitted to enroll in 10 courses per year. Under certain circumstances students may be allowed to take a fourth course in a term.

Students who are making satisfactory progress in their program of study are allowed to enroll in one fourth course during an academic year at no extra charge, provided they have a GPA of at least 3.3. These courses can be used to enhance the student’s academic experience at Union. All such courses will appear on the transcript and can be used to fulfill program requirements; however, **they can not be used for the purpose of accelerated graduation.** (This includes fourth courses taken on a Term Abroad.)

Fourth courses can also be used to make up a deficiency in credits due to withdrawals or failure. A 4th course fee will be charged under these circumstances (for 2012-2013 the fee will be approximately \$3,315). Students whose GPA is below 2.5 will need the written permission from Dean Bidoshi before signing up for a fourth course.

All students, including engineering students, with the exception of Leadership in Medicine (LIM) and Scholar Students will be required to fill out the “Petition to Enroll in a Fourth Course” form. CROSS REGISTRATION

All graduate level courses taken by Union undergraduates, including Leadership in Medicine and Combined Degree students will be taken through Union Graduate College and will require completion of a special “Union Graduate College” Cross Registration Form. DESCRIPTIONS OF COURSES NOT IN THE 2011-2012 ACADEMIC REGISTER

AMU 051 Symbol and Sound: Teaching the Brain to Read Music Notation. J. Cox. The purpose of this class is to serve as an introduction to music notation, ear training, and sight singing. Students will learn to read music and to sing from notation without the aid of a keyboard or other fixed-pitch instrument. Class time will be spent performing group and individual exercises designed to improve rhythmic and pitch accuracy. This course will work on the premise that students learn musical skills in much the same order as they do language skills. We will train the ear before teaching them to read and later write music.

CSC 321 Data Mining and Machine Learning. N. Webb. The object of this course is to introduce Data Mining, where previously unknown and potentially useful information is automatically extracted from data sources, using regularities or patterns of implicit information. Such patterns can be used to make predictions over future data, and to explain and understand the nature of that data. Machine Learning is one mechanism by which data mining is achieved. It is used to discover and extract information from raw data. This course will cover tools and techniques of machine learning that are used in practical data mining, and will include theoretical and practical aspects of machine learning as a tool for mining data, as well as knowledge of methods and techniques for learning, application and evaluation. Students will gain familiarity with open source machine learning tools, such as WEKA and Octave. Prerequisite: CSC-250.

CSC 281/282/283 Practicum. V. Barr. Under the supervision of a CSC faculty member, students may participate in undergraduate research or a design project. To receive pass/fail credit equivalent to one elective course, a student must receive a passing grade in three terms of the practicum course. Up to two credits may be earned in this way. Prerequisite: Permission of the faculty supervisor and the department chair. To receive Pass/Fail credit equivalent to one course, the student must earn 3 terms of passing grades for the practicum experience. Petition required.

ECE 321 Data Mining and Machine Learning. N. Webb. See CSC 321.

ECO 330 Environmental Economic Valuation. D. Nunez. The main goal of this course is to know different methodologies to conduct environmental economic valuation projects, showing examples of empirical applications for policy decision purposes. The students will learn how these methodologies have been carried out to approach a variety of environmental problems. They will also examine how economic valuation results have been used to orient environmental policy-making decision process, analyzing empirical applications in different countries.

FLM 305 Community Media Shout Out. J. de Seve. Head beyond the Union fence to merge media and community action in this hands-on media production class. You will work closely with a local arts/community/social activist organization as you develop a short video about or to aid the group. Videos might be designed for broadcast, web, group promotion, for education of communities served, etc. Petition Required.

FRN 440 Black Cosmopolitans. S. Silvestre. The purpose of this course is to analyze the Black African, African-American and/or Caribbean presence in European capitals (i.e., Paris, London, Brussels) and American cities (i.e., New-York, Miami) and compare their living experiences in a plurality of narratives. We will examine these complex sites and the representations of these cosmopolitan places as a bit of heaven and/or a slice of hell by focusing on the life of women and men of African descent who came to live in these cities in search of a better life, adventures and opportunities. We will see how these vibrant urban centers present similarities and differences in terms of adaptation and perception of African, African-American and/or Caribbean people during the 20th and 21st centuries. Prerequisite: Any 300 level FRN course.

HST 185 Modern Southeast Asia. C. Gan. Does Aung San Suu Kyi stand a chance against the Burmese junta? Is Ho Chi Minh still relevant in a modernizing Vietnam? Why are Al Qaeda allies bombing targets in Indonesia, home of the world's largest Muslim population? These are just a sampling of contemporary issues confronting Southeast Asia, a region that historically was and still is at the crossroads of ideas, trade, religions and conquering armies. While Southeast Asia is made up of diverse polities with their own unique stories, they have been exposed to common historical dynamics that have deepened regional commonalities. This course looks at European colonization and the indigenous response; the shaping of a modern colonial plural society; the effects of economic transformation; the evolution of indigenous women's role; anti-colonialism and nationalism; the Japanese conquest in World War II; decolonization and the Cold War; the American experience in the Philippines and Vietnam; and nation-building. We will look not only at the histories of Burma/Myanmar, the Philippines, Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia and Vietnam, but also at transnational themes.

HST 303 Islam in Africa. B. Peterson. This course will examine the social, cultural and political history of Islam in Africa. More particularly, we will explore the beginnings of Islam in Africa, the relationship between Islam and African states, Sufism and 'modernist reformers,' Women in Islamic Africa, Muslim states and slavery, political Islamism and democracy, and the intersection of local and global forces in the constitution of Muslim societies in Africa. The course will be a discussion-oriented class, drawing on primary and secondary source readings. Petition Required.

IDM 210 Culture of Respect. P. Poczik This course is an examination of systems of oppression. In particular we will be exploring: racism, sexism, classism, heterosexism, ableism, ageism, and religious oppression. The approach we will take to study these topics is one of experiential learning. As the students in the class, you will essentially be the textbooks for our study. Much of our time will be spent exploring the misinformation and stereotypes that enable systems of oppression to exist and perpetuate. These conversations are either going to be really hard or hardly real. It is up to you as students to determine the quality of this educational experience. Our goal is to draw connections between the various systems of oppression, to recognize how we can be allies to each other across identities by building coalitions, and ultimately to leave the class equipped with tools that will enable us to interrupt cycles of oppression.

IDM 215 Entrepreneurship & Digital Media. C. Henseler. The twenty-first century presents students with unprecedented challenges of political, economic, social, and environmental issues. To face the impact of these challenges, "Entrepreneurship and Digital Media" empowers students to civically engage with this increasingly complex, diverse, changing, and technology-driven world. The goal of this course is to examine how digital media technologies are being used for entrepreneurial purposes: for creative innovation, to identify new opportunities, develop new collaborations, new approaches, and create new value.

LAS 101 Intro to Latin American Studies. D. Mosquera. Through a reflexive and multidisciplinary approach relying on such fields as anthropology, arts, economics, literature, music, philosophy, political science, visual history, and other approaches, disciplines and cultural expressions, LAS 101 explores Latin America and the Caribbean from pre-Columbian times to the present in order to understand the nature of enduring cultural forms and institutions, their adaptations through time and contact, and the sensibilities and imaginaries woven into and out of them through memory traditions and the writing and living of history itself. An introduction to Latin America and the Caribbean as a multi linguistic, multicultural geography and to the Latin American and Caribbean Studies (LACS) Program at Union College, LAS 101 is also a foundational course. Drawing on a selective but coherent critical trail, on stimulating films, and occasionally on the expertise of LACS faculty and others, students will be exposed to the diversity of literatures, cultures, and histories of Latin America, to how these traditions acquired influence, and to the interactions among Latin American countries and between Latin American countries and the rest of the world. Required for LACS majors and minors. CC: HUL/LCC.

MTH 064 Statistical Thinking. Staff. Our world is obviously becoming more complex, data-rich, and uncertain (stochastic) every day. This course seeks to provide the conceptual foundation and analytical skills required to understand such a world from a stochastic versus deterministic perspective, and to navigate through the daily bombardment of data from all sides. In addition to developing conceptual understanding and skills in basic problem-solving tools, the course will also present formal statistical methods, such as experimental design and regression analysis. Case studies will be drawn from diverse fields such as business, sports, genetics, political science, engineering, criminal justice, education, and health policy. CC: QMR.

PHL 233 Early Modern Philosophy. D. Barnett. Examination of classic philosophical works by Descartes, Leibniz, Locke, Berkeley, Hume and Kant. Central topics will include the existence of God, the relationship between the mind and the body, the possibility of free will, and the nature and limitations of our knowledge of ourselves and the world around us.

PHL 411/412 Writing Philosophy Workshop. L. Zaibert. Two-term workshop on argumentative writing skills. Students will learn how to write philosophy papers. Honors theses in philosophy will be written in the course of participating in this workshop. The course will be required of all philosophy majors. PHL 411 will be Pass/Fail. PHL 412 will receive one credit. When registering for PHL 411 you must also register for 3 other courses.

PSC 160 The Presidential Election of 2012. C. Brown/Z. Oxley. This course will consist of an in-depth examination of the 2012 presidential election in the United States. Candidates, developments, and events of the 2012 cycle will be analyzed, as well as placed within their broader historical and conceptual contexts. By the end of the course, students should have a detailed understanding of how candidates run for the presidency, why some voters vote and others do not, how voters decide which candidates to support, and why the winning candidates win. They will also understand the electoral roles of various actors, including the media, political parties, and campaign consultants. Moreover, they will understand how players frame issues and set agendas. Throughout the course, students will also evaluate presidential elections and discuss possible reforms. There are no pre-requisites. It will count for the Political Science major in the American subfield.

PSC 217R Global Value Chains. M. Dallas. A cup of coffee or tea, your laptop computer or mobile phone, the clothes you are wearing today. In a globalizing world, we all vaguely know that these are often produced elsewhere. But exactly how and where are everyday products produced? What are the effects on the producing and consuming countries? How exactly is everything coordinated from there to here? Do the differences between products really matter, or is it just all undifferentiated 'trade'? This course considers a handful of everyday products like these (and some illicit ones) and examines the primary countries where they are produced and consumed, including the politics of their production, the labor regimes used in ensuring their production, the transnational corporations which coordinate the chain of production and consumption, how they are globally traded and the linkages this creates between developing and developed countries. The course will first introduce some basic conceptual building blocks which will help us organize the extraordinary variety of places, production processes, policies and populations engaged in global value chains. However, we will spend most of the course examining one commodity or product at a time, using what we learned along the way to build an increasingly sophisticated understanding of global production and exchange. Finally, students will conduct research on their own product of choice for a final project. Prerequisites: PSC 111, 112 or sophomore standing.

PSC 238 Concepts in Political Theory: American Exceptionalism. Staff. This course will examine the competing versions of American exceptionalism that pervade American history and political thought, helping to explain the history of American political thought and to better understand the role of political ideology in contemporary politics. Included in the discussions will be political theory from the colonial period through the present era. Specific topics will include American versions of Republicanism and Democracy, American character, slavery, race, women's rights, ethnicity, class, and the way progressives, liberals, and conservatives confront political questions in America. Prerequisites: PSC 111, 112, 113 or Sophomore standing.

PSC 339 Political Theory Seminar: Black Radical Politics and the Legacies of Malcolm X. L. Marso. In this seminar we will explore the legacy of Malcolm X as an icon in Black radical politics. We will dissect and compare his vision with other Black radicals that both draw on and depart from Malcolm's. First, we will explore Malcolm's history and legacy to see how class politics, ideological differences, and perspectives on sex and gender within the Black community impact how Malcolm is described, remembered, and lionized. Second, we also think about Malcolm's legacy through an internationalist lens, which was Manning Marable's approach in his recent biography. Finally, we will discover how Black nationalists and Muslims the world over have claimed Malcolm as their own, with their own emphases and nuanced narratives. Underlying questions throughout our discussions will be: What are the politics of memory? What is at stake in how we frame, celebrate, or critique a figure like Malcolm X? When we focus on sexuality and gender, does the vision of what is radical change, and if so, how and why? To explore these questions and others that arise, our seminar will view Malcolm in comparative perspective vis-à-vis women activists and thinkers such as Ella Baker, Fannie Lou Hamer, and Assata Shakur, as well as other Black Radical thinkers and writers such as Richard Wright and James Baldwin. We will also read work and view films that reveal how Malcolm is viewed today and help us to uncover what is at stake politically in constructing these very different legacies. Applicable for Women's and Gender Studies, Africana Studies, and American Studies.

REL 281 Introduction to Buddhism. O. Solovieva. This course will be an inquiry into the Buddhist tradition as it developed across 2500 years within many different social and cultural contexts. After starting the course with a basic historical and thematic introduction, we will then proceed to look at a range of Buddhist religious teachings, ethical systems, and meditative techniques, including those of Theravada, Mahayana, Zen and Tibetan traditions. We also will be raising a question of Buddhism's role in the contemporary world, both in traditional Buddhist Asian countries and here in the West. To answer this question, we will read the writings by prominent activists and thinkers of the "socially engaged" Buddhism, look at the connections between Buddhism and modern psychology and spiritual practice, and attend to the Buddhist analysis of the predicaments of contemporary society. Throughout the course, we will be talking and thinking together about just what "Buddhism" is, from ancient India to the twenty-first century "global village."

SPN 360 Spanish Communication: Speaking and Writing in Contemporary Settings. M. Osuna. The goal of this course is to build oral proficiency in Spanish at advanced levels. Oral communication will be supported by readings and intensive writing in the target language. Acquisition of linguistically and culturally appropriate oral skills will allow students to communicate successfully in academic and professional settings as well as daily life. Prerequisite: SPN 203. Petition required.
