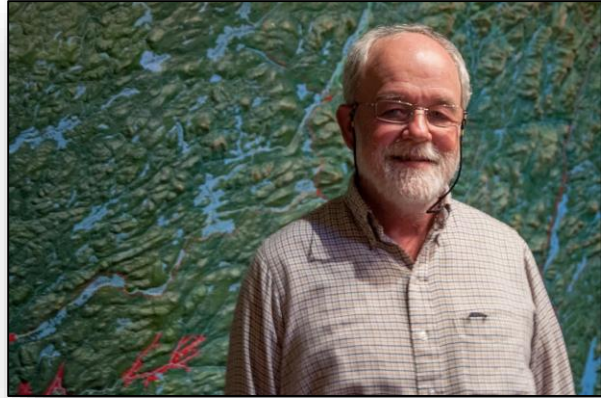


Still Here, Gone, Introduced and Returned: People and Mammals in the Adirondacks
