Places, in and of themselves, do not embody a single identity; rather, human interaction with place constructs multiple identities. Hence, places are not stationary enclosures with clearly delineated boundaries. Instead, like human beings, places are liminal entities that shift, change, and develop over time. When individuals develop affectional bonds to various places, both the individuals and the places they inhabit are intrinsically altered. This talk will focus on both the material and immaterial bonds that humans develop to place, specifically with respect to the variety of attachments humans develop with wilderness places, like the Adirondack Mountains.
