

## Student Right-to-Know Act Graduation/Completion Rate Report

The following information about graduation/completion rates is provided in compliance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. The rates reflect the graduation/completion status of students who enrolled during the fall term of the 2015-16 academic year and for whom 150% of the normal time-to-completion of a four-year, undergraduate degree has elapsed.
