UNDERGRADUATE MATH SEMINAR


The next math seminar will be back in its usual location, Bailey 207. The preseminar refreshments will still be in the Math Common Room, Bailey 204 and yummy.

Abstract: Interested in learning about students' research over the summer / academic year? Josh will present data analysis within PIV fluid dynamics research and PIV measurements of heterogeneous canopies. Zekai (Kai) will present predicting one-year survival rate for heart failure patients and COVID-19 patients with heart disease. Zhebin (Irene) will present classification of lung cancer circulating tumor cells in liquid biopsy using deep learning.

Professor Zwicker is actively pursuing his mathematical research ... in France, with support from a prestigious fellowship.

Participants in the contest spend 6 hours (in two sittings, a morning session and an afternoon session) trying to solve 12 problems. Problems on the "exam" are generally *quite challenging*, but not specialized. In other words, they are accessible to students who may or may not have taken advanced courses.



What We Did this Summer

Continuing the series from last week's newsletter, here is another bullet point highlighting some of the activities of some of the math faculty this past summer.

• Professor Jue (Joy) Wang supervised two students doing summer research, one on lung cancer categorization using deep learning and the other on survival prediction of heart failure patients with COVID-19. She submitted a grant proposal on kidney cancer research to the Department of Defense (DoD) - Congressionally Directed Medical Research Programs. She made a final revision on a book chapter, titled "Mathematics for Sustainable Humanity – Population, Climate, Energy, Economy, Policy, and Social Justice" for the Foundations for Undergraduate Research in Mathematics. She was invited to speak at the Data Science for Social and Environmental Justice Summer Writing Group and attended a three-week workshop on Mathematical Sciences in Obesity Research.
