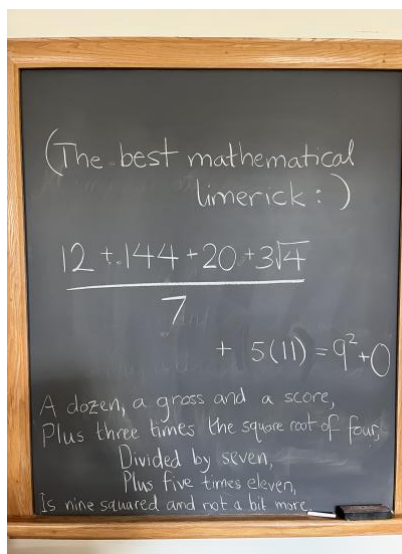
Who Are the Math Majors?
