Summer IDEaS

SUMMER RESEARCH OPPORTUNITY

This summer, Schaffer Library will be inaugurating an annual paid research opportunity for students—the Summer Institute for Digital Exploration at Schaffer, or Summer IDEaS. Summer IDEaS seeks to introduce students from across the disciplines to digital scholarship (DS), an increasingly typical approach to inquiry that draws and reflects upon computational methods of research.

Manifold Digital Publishing Platform

DIGITAL PUBLISHING OPPORTUNITY

Schaffer Library has secured a one-year Manifold Digital Services Support Grant, made possible by a grant to Manifold by The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation.

We will use this grant to pilot digital publishing services for teaching and research using the open source Manifold digital publishing platform developed by the University of Minnesota Press and CUNY Graduate Center. Manifold updates scholarly publishing for the digital age, enabling the incorporation of multimedia alongside text, interactivity through annotation, and publishing that is open access. While Manifold can be used for any form of scholarly publishing, from monographs to journals, we are especially excited to support uses of Manifold in the classroom that enable innovative pedagogy and the creation of student journals, and open educational resources. 



Chronicle of Higher Education



Capital District Library Council Grant


Schaffer Library has successfully applied for a grant from the Capital District Library Council (CDLC) to digitize the diary of Jonathan Pearson. Pearson graduated from Union College in 1835 where he went on to teach Chemistry and Natural History before moving into the positions of Librarian and Treasurer. His diary, 2,500 pages in length, details his experiences and travels, as well as his observations, as a member of the College's administration. Pearson reflects on longtime College President Eliphalet Nott, as well as many important issues and events of the period. This work has monumental significance for the history of Union College and the state of New York. The digitized content of the diary will be shared with the New York Heritage platform.

New Exhibition: *Documenting Union*

An exhibit entitled Documenting Union is now up in Beuth Atrium. The exhibit showcases original manuscripts, maps, ephemera, and more from the Document Collection (SCA-1101). The collection contains materials from the 17th to 20th centuries and was put together by administrators and librarians as a way to centralize and preserve early records related to the founding of Union, New York history, as well as miscellaneous materials kept for their historical value. This series of prints was inspired by "early Bengali feminist author and social reformer," Rokeya Sakhawat Hossain, and her 1905 story of the same title published by Durham Press.


