DIRECTORS NOTE

I've approached the process of directing A Midsummer Night's Dream with far more questions than answers. Why another Shakespeare play in 2022? What are we offering the audience and our community at large? What benefit are we offering the students? I've come across two articles of particular resonance to these inquiries. Interrogating the Shakespeare System by Mohegan Shakespeare scholar Madeline Sayet in the HowlRound Theatre Commons suggests that we examine how we've positioned Shakespeare's works in our collective minds and esteems "After all, the education system in the United States has trained all of us to believe Shakespeare is the best. Why else would he be the only playwright required in the American Common Core, our academic standards for education? Why else would he be the most produced playwright in the United States? Why else would he be the way children are introduced to theatre? It is that very placement of Shakespeare as the pinnacle of theatrical achievement that I suggest we interrogate" (Sayet). In an article in American Theatre Magazine by Rob Weinert-Kendt, Why Keep Doing Shakespeare? Maybe That's the Wrong Question the author interviews Rosa Joshi of Seattle's upstart crow collective, who offers "For me it's really important to approach the work knowing that it takes skill and craft, but then to have a healthy irreverence about it—not to put it up on a pedestal... You also have to have the humility to know that this work will live on beyond your production. There's no ideal King John; we're doing this version for this audience now."

What you're about to see is a highly condensed version of the original text. I find something very exciting about taking a revered, well-loved classic and dropping it to the floor and then picking up the shiniest pieces and making something out of them. It's been a true joy to see the actors take this text and find life and humor in the density of the language. This is a true ensemble piece, and we have actors, designers and crew members from across disciplines and departments collaborating to find our own collective version of this very old play. I'm very grateful for the flexibility and openmindedness of the A Midsummer Night's Dream team, and I promise that we've kept you, our contemporary audience, as our compass as we navigated this text.
