DRAMATURG'S NOTE

Timely, Tense, True.

Written in 2015, *Sweat* earned American playwright Lynn Nottage a Pulitzer Prize for Drama in 2017. Produced on Broadway in the same year, it received recognition for its "timely narrative" for coinciding with the American political climate. Set in 2000 and 2008, *Sweat* tells the story of a working-class community in the town of Reading, Pennsylvania, a town facing uncertainties that reflect the steep political and economic state of America: in many ways, mirroring the America of today.

Through the Clinton and Bush eras, a sequence of dire socio-economic changes occurred. Nottage approaches capturing this period of time with references drizzled in each scene. Mentions of NAFTA, declines in stocks, contentious presidential candidates, local and national personalities have a space in this play. One prevalent theme is the controversies that came with unionization and its impacts on blue-collar workers. By visiting Reading in this time, we see how bonds in the story are affected by underlying racism and disillusionment of the "American Dream." Reading and Schenectady in this time relate, both small cities housing big industries going through turmoil.

Nottage suggests entering the space with curiosity instead of judgment—curiosity that leads you to experience that period of time in America with the characters. In celebration of the power of theatre - making space for stories lived and not yet told - enjoy *Sweat*.
