DIRECTOR'S NOTE

When I was growing up I wasn't really allowed to watch The Simpsons on TV. My mother thought the language was rude. "Toxic," she might have called it. I liked that the show was edgy and irreverent. It was rude. At the time, however, the absurd social commentary mostly went over my head. We were surrounded by the absurd and the toxic, it seemed to say, and under that kind of exposure it was no wonder that families – like these spiky-haired yellow cartoon people – were mutating.

In their toxic world were they adapting to survive? Infecting others? Digesting the change? Were they even conscious of their own mutations? It's hard to say.

Thirty six years after The Simpsons premiered and we are mutating – at human speed – changing a little at a time while our technologies are reshaping our lives more quickly than we can physically process the changes. As the waste and plastics pile up around us, we need better, faster technology to digest the indigestible materials we have created. At the same time we have our analog, human work to do: the work of healing and singing and telling the stories that form the communities that imagine, value, and invest in such processes.

In addition to this being my first year at Union, this has been a year of particularly dramatic change. I believe as humans we make meaning from change through art. Art grounds us in creativity, agency, and relationship through change. Throughout the year I have been impressed, moved, and inspired by the students here who are showing up in the face of these changes, making art, finding meaning, and co-imagining their futures.

It has been a joy collaborating with the students, faculty, staff, and guest artists on the making of this production. It is beyond what any one of us could have imagined on our own, and I am grateful to be part of this community – part of this story.
